the base

- 1 stick unsalted butter
- 1/3 c. granulated sugar
- 1/3 c. unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1 large egg, beaten
- 1 sleeve saltines (40 crackers, regular or whole wheat), finely crushed
- 3/4 c. finely chopped roasted peanuts

COBBLE COOKS

the filling and glaze

- 1/4 c. grape jelly
- 7 tbsp plus 1 tsp unsalted butter, softened
- 1/3 c. creamy peanut butter
- 1/2 c. confectioners' sugar
- 4 oz semisweet chocolate, chopped

here's how

Make the base Line an 8-inch square baking pan with foil, extending it over the sides. Put the butter in a medium heatproof bowl; position the bowl over a saucepan of barely simmering water (the bowl should not touch the water). Once the butter melts, stir in the sugar and cocoa. Whisk in the egg; cook, whisking, until the mixture is warm and the consistency of hot fudge, 6 minutes. Remove from the heat; mix in the saltine crumbs and peanuts. Press the crust into the pan. Set aside the saucepan of water.

Make the filling Spread the jelly over the crust in the pan; place in the freezer for a

few minutes. Beat 5 tablespoons plus 1 teaspoon butter, the peanut butter and confectioners' sugar with a mixer until light. Spread over the jelly layer; return to the freezer while you make the glaze.

Place the chocolate and the remaining 2 tablespoons butter in a heatproof bowl; set over the pan of simmering water and stir until the chocolate is melted. Remove from the heat; stir until smooth. When cool but still runny, spread the glaze over the chilled peanut butter layer. Freeze for another 30 minutes.

Use the foil flaps to remove the bars from the pan; cut into squares while still cold. Serve cold and keep leftovers refrigerated

A new corps of volunteers, or **"Ambassadors"** for the **First State National Monument** will be on hand at the Visitor's Table at the **May Market on May 2nd** on the New Castle Green. They will share information about the sites included in the Monument, and specifically about colonial settlement in Delaware from 1631-1776.

After several months of training and organization, the Ambassadors will be making their first public appearance to connect people to natural and historic resources included in the Monument. The 26 volunteers have been gearing up to provide roving interpretive services and information to visitors through training workshops provided by the National Park Service, and hands-on site interpretation from the New Castle Historical Society, Delaware Historical Society, and Delaware State Museums.

Russell Smith, FSNM Superintendent, is delighted to be instituting this ground-breaking approach to resource interpretation and visitor services in Old New Castle, where the First State National Monument has its headquarters. "The energy and enthusiasm has been electric," he said. "Volunteer Coordinator Debbie Keese, herself a volunteer, has done an outstanding job of directing the program."

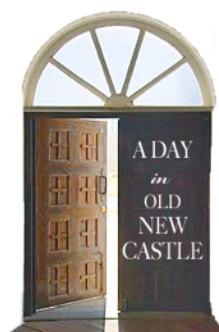
