



 $1\ 1\!\!/\!2$  tsps finely chopped onion -1  $1\!\!/\!2$  tbsps unsalted butter - 2 tbsps all-purpose flour - 1  $1\!\!/\!2$  cups milk - a pinch of cayenne - 1 tbsp dry Sherry -  $3\!\!/\!4$  cup grated extra-sharp Cheddar - 4 slices of homemade-type white bread, toasted lightly -  $1\!\!/\!2$  lb cooked turkey breast, sliced thin - 4 thin slices of tomato - 8 slices of cooked bacon - 1 tbsp freshly grated Parmesan

#### let's do it!

- 1. In a small saucepan cook the onion in the butter over moderately low heat, stirring, until it is softened, stir in the flour, and cook the *roux*, stirring, for 3 minutes. Remove the pan from the heat and add the milk, scalded, in a stream, whisking vigorously until the mixture is thick and smooth. Add the cayenne and salt and pepper to taste and simmer the sauce, stirring occasionally, for 10 to 15 minutes, or until it is thickened to the desired consistency. Strain the sauce through the fine sieve into a bowl and add the Sherry and Cheddar, stirring until the mixture is smooth.
- 2. Arrange the toasts in a baking pan and divide the turkey among them. Top each sandwich with a tomato slice and 2 slices of the bacon and spoon the sauce evenly over the sandwiches. Sprinkle the sandwiches with the Parmesan and broil them under a preheated broiler about 4 inches from the heat for 5 to 7 minutes, or until the tops are brown and bubbly.







#### **Full Pink Moon**

In fact, the Titanic was carrying 12,000 cases of the condiment scheduled for delivery in Vera Cruz, Mexico, which was to be the next port of call for the great ship after its stop in New York. For reasons of historical interest, the popularity of mayonnaise in Mexico at this time was phenomenal. This would have been the largest single shipment of mayonnaise ever delivered to Mexico. But as we know, the great ship did not make it to New York. The ship hit an iceberg & sank, & the cargo was forever lost. The people of Mexico, who were fond of mayonnaise, and were eagerly awaiting its delivery, were disconsolate at the loss. Their anguish was so great, that they declared a National Day of Mourning, which they still observe to this day. The National Day of Mourning occurs each year on May 5th & is known, of course, as Sinko de Mayo.
