

Some days it's nice to roll out of bed and know that breakfast is only minutes away. Skillet Texás Hash is the perfect breakfast potatoes recipe to make after you and your family havé slept in.

#### OGather Up O

4 potatoes, peeled, diced ♥ ½ lb breakfast sausage ♥ 8 slices thick cut bacon, diced ♥ 3 cloves garlic, diced • 1 white onion, diced • 2 fresh jalapeños, sliced • 2 chipotle peppers, minced ½ bunch green onions, sliced 🧿 1 tsp creole seasoning 🖸 1 tsp ea.. garlic & onion powder 🐧 ½ tsp black pepper 3 ½ tsp chili powder 3 ¼ tsp crushed red pepper 3 1c. cheddar cheese, grated

In a medium pot add diced potatoes, cover with cold water and boil for 5 minutes. Drain and set aside.

In a medium skillet add 1 tbsp of olive oil and heat over medium heat. Add bacon and cook until crispy. Drain bacon and set aside.

Reserve 2 tbsp of bacon grease and add white onion, jalapeños, chipotle peppers and sauté for 5 minutes, add garlic and sauté 1 minute more. Add breakfast sausage and cook until browned about 7 minutes, add potatoes and add all spices.

Mix mixture well and cook for about 5 minutes, stirring occasionally. Heat broiler. Toss in bacon and half of green onions into potato mixture, top with cheese and place under broiler for 3-4 minutes or until cheese melts. Remove from oven and sprinkle remaining green onions on top.

Serve with sour cream.

#### LAVENDER LEMON DROP

This recipe is adapted a little bit because to lightly muddle the lavender in the simple syrup. Another option is to use a lavender-infused simple syrup, which is very easy to make and nice to have in stock in the spring and summer. A fantastic adaptation of the popular Lemon Drop Martini in which the lavender adds depth and counteracts the sour of the lemon juice just enough

to make a difference.

To do:

- ◆2 ounces <u>Tru Organic Lemon Vodka</u>
- ◆1 ounce fresh lemon juice
- **♦**Lavender sprig
- ◆1 Tablespoon simple syrup
- ◆Lavender sprig for garnish





The Planning Commission covered a lot of ground at their Monday meeting but not with asphalt or concrete as many feared who had come to present their feelings and concerns.

The Parking Sub-Committee, chaired by Jo Viola, recommended five possible locations that could be considered as off-street parking facilities. Some questioned if there was a parking problem in town. Others suggested finding an alternate place for those employed in the downtown area to park. This would open open spaces for visitors and shoppers.

The Parking Sub-Committee proposal presented to the Planning Commission asked only to have the Council consider locations and concepts and define the scope and prioritize the locations according to a variety of considerations. The Parking Committee did not specifically recommend "paving" for any of the sites but to consider a variety of issues for the suitability of each location. Those areas presented to the Commission are included in detail on page 6.

Many residents voiced their concerns which included the flooding of Battery Park and the "bowl" at the tennis courts. Enlarging the 3rd Street lot concerned residents along that narrow street. Many have had vehicles damaged.

The purpose of the meeting was to identify any recommendations and for the possibility of available funding to study the feasibility of proceeding. It's important to note that no engineering study has been initiated. Two locations, Fort Casimir and Broad Dike, will be studied for possible grants/ funding.

The Downtown Gateway Zone maximum building height lead to quite a discussion that resulted in deleting "3 stories" with "a maximum height of 45 feet from mean ground level".

The missing convex mirror at Dalby Alley raised safety concerns before the committee. Dalby Alley resident Lula Atherton, spoke of the dangers of exiting without seeing approaching pedestrians or traffic, siting occasions where drivers narrowly missed children riding bikes on the sidewalk, even with an adult following. The City engineer suggested the proper plans would include eliminating two parking spaces on either side of the Alley, enlarging the depth of the sidewalks into the street. That would include handicap ramps like the ones by the Court House. After alternatives were discussed the solution was to replace the mirror with the addition of **No Trucks** signage. An additional mirror may be installed at a later date.

Earlier, John Fellows of Duffield Associates presented the Coastal Plan Update which will be the subject of a future article. The minutes of the meeting will soon be available on the City website.

The next Planning Commission meeting will be *Monday*, *May* 19th at 6:30 pm in the Town Hall. It's advised to eat early and come to be part of New Castle's future plans.





# Cinco de Mayo

Most people don't know that back in 1912, Hellmann's mayonnaise was still manufactured in England. In fact, the Titanic was carrying 12,000 cases of the condiment scheduled for delivery in Vera Cruz, Mexico, which was to be the next port of call for the great ship after its stop in New York. For reasons of historical interest, the popularity of mayonnaise in Mexico at this time was phenomenal. This would have been the largest single shipment of mayonnaise ever delivered to Mexico. But as we know, the great ship did not make it to New York. The ship hit an iceberg & sank, & the cargo was forever lost. The people of Mexico, who were fond of mayonnaise, and were eagerly awaiting its delivery, were disconsolate at the loss. Their anguish was so great, that they declared a National Day of Mourning, which they still observe to this day. The National Day of Mourning occurs each year on May 5th & is known, of course, as Sinko de Mayo.




