

These classic, flaky buttermilk biscuits from award-winning cookbook author Virginia Willis are the epitome of Southern baking. After baking up a batch, youll see what kind of magic these few ingredients — butter,

buttermilk, leavening and soft
White Lily flour — can make with the
proper technique. A light hand with
mixing and just a couple turns of the
dough yields light-as-a-feather flakes
and a tender crumb that's perfect for
slathering with butter and homemade jam.

YOU'LL NEED

2 cups White Lily or other Southern all-purpose flour (see note), plus more for rolling out the biscuits

1 tbsp baking powder - 1 tsp fine sea salt - 4 tbsps cold unsalted butter, cut into small pieces and chilled- 3/4 to 1 cup buttermilk

READY?

Make oven happy to 500°. Line a rimmed baking sheet with a nonstick silicone baking sheet.

In a large bowl, combine the flour, baking powder and salt. Using a pastry cutter or two knives, cut the butter into the flour mixture until it resembles coarse meal. Pour in the buttermilk, and gently mix until just combined.

Turn the dough out onto a lightly floured surface. Knead lightly, using the heel of your hand to compress and push the dough away from you, then fold it back over itself. Give the dough a small turn and repeat 8 or so times. (It's not yeast bread; you want to just barely activate the gluten, not overwork it.) Using a lightly floured rolling pin, roll the dough out 1/2 inch thick. Cut out rounds of dough with a 2 1/4-inch round cutter dipped in flour; press the cutter straight down without twisting so the biscuits will rise evenly when baked.

Place the biscuits on the prepared baking sheet. If the biscuits are baked close together the sides will be moist. If the biscuits are baked further apart, the sides will be crisp. Bake until golden brown, 8 to 10 minutes. Transfer to a rack to cool just slightly. Serve warm.

(I lighter take on the classic dry Martini, the 50-50 is made with equal parts gin and dry vermouth. You can use Lillet Blanc instead of dry vermouth for a refreshing brunch or lunchtime drink.

1 part your fav gin 1 part dry vermouth

Stir ingredients in a mixing glass filled with ice and either strain into a chilled cocktail glass or into an ice-filled rocks glass.

Squirrels are persistent and often destructive pests of container plantings. They have grown accustomed to humans and have all day to find ways to overcome barriers. It will take a variety of tactics and persistence on your part to keep them away. Try treating your plants with cayenne pepper as you plant, or use scare tactics, like motion-sensitive sprinklers and pinwheels.

Cover new plantings with fine netting to allow air, light and water through but discourage digging. The squirrels may lose interest and move on. Once plants are established, remove the covering and monitor for squirrel damage.

Felix duPont in 1921. She became interested in Hockessin and the Babies' Hospital (known later as St. Michael's Day Nursery) and encouraged her friends to donate whatever they could. Approximately 25 volunteers joined her for this worthy cause by donating plants, baked goods, flowers, guinea pigs, kittens, puppies and even birds.


Always held on Mother's Day weekend in May, it has grown and changed to accommodate the increased attendance and traffic conditions. Throughout its history it has been held in just three locations:



Cool Spring Park (1921-1950), Brandywine Park (1950-1951), Rockford Park (1952-Present). The Rockford Water Tower, completed in 1901, has been the focal point of the flower market.

Just after 1900, Wilmington significantly improved its water service. The city laid new mains and built a pumping station, reservoir, and sand filter plant. It also constructed Rockford Water Tower, completed in 1901. The 1901 tower encloses a steel tank 40 feet in diameter and 60 feet high, fabricated by the Edge Moor

Iron Company in Wilmington.It has a capacity of 500,000 gallons and weighs 6,000 tons empty. The bottom of the tank consists of 6 riveted 5/8-inch steel plates. The sides are constructed of tiers of six 1/4-inch steel plates measuring 5 feet high and 21 feet long. The side plates were fastened, end to end, with a double row of rivets, driven by a pneumatic riveter. Enclosing the tank is a stone masonry shell contructed of Brandywine granite from Rockford Park, "laid underpointed so that the tower. . .[looks] like a pile of rocks that has stood for centuries." The interior surface of the shell is lined with white enamelled brick, and between it and the tank is a steel staircase with masonry overlay that provides access to an observation platform above the tank.
