fried pickles



If you like pickles and you like fried foods—and really, who doesn't?!—these bite-sized treats are for you, try them out!

Gotta get Pickles and...

2 ½ cs dill pickles, drained and patted dry, 1 c milk, ½ c all-purpose flour, ¼ c yellow cornmeal, 2 eggs, 2 tps Cajun seasoning, ¾ tsp Italian seasoning, ½ tsp cayenne pepper, kosher salt and freshly ground pepper, to taste, vegetable oil, for frying

Dip...no jar stuff here!

½ c mayonnaise • 1 tbsp drained horseradish
• 2 1/2 tps ketchup • ½ tsp Cajun seasoning

Let's make em!

- ➔ Pour enough vegetable oil into a large Dutch oven that it's 1/3 full. Heat over medium-high heat until it reaches 350° F on a deep-fryer thermometer.
- ➔ In a medium bowl, combine mayonnaise, horseradish, ketchup and Cajun seasoning and mix until incorporated.
- ➔ Cover and place in refrigerator until chilled.
- ➔ Whisk eggs and milk together in a large bowl until smooth and combined.
- ➔ In a separate bowl, mix together flour, cornmeal, Cajun seasoning, Italian seasoning, cayenne, salt and pepper. Taste and adjust, if necessary.
- ➔ Place pickles in egg mixture and soak completely, then dredge thoroughly in seasoned flour mixture.
- ➔ *Note: repeat egg wash and flour dredging for a thicker crust on pickles.*
- ➔ Shake off excess and carefully lower pickles into frying oil.
- ➔ In batches, cook pickles for 3-5 minutes, flipping in the middle, or until golden brown and crispy.
- ➔ Remove with a slotted spoon and place on a paper towel-lined plate.
- ➔ Repeat with remaining pickles, then season with another sprinkle of salt.
- ➔ Serve immediately with dip and enjoy!

gin-roasted olives

¼ cup Extra-virgin olive oil, plus more for serving

● 8 oz Drained Castelvetrano olives ● 2 sprigs Fresh rosemary ● ¼ cup Gin
let's do it!

In a frying pan set over high heat, warm the oil until it is almost smoking. Add the olives, and cook, shaking the pan occasionally, just until the olives begin to blister and brown, three to five minutes. Add the rosemary. Pour the gin into the pan. If you are working on a gas burner, it should light on fire. If you're cooking on an electric range, light the gin with a match. Let cook until the flames die out, about one minute. Pour off the oil and any juices in the pan.

Transfer the olives to a serving bowl and let cool to room temperature. Drizzle with more extra-virgin olive oil just before serving.

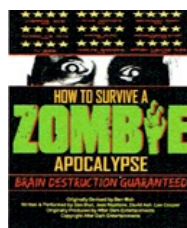

TRUSTEES CORNER

Just a few kernels from the Trustees meeting last Tuesday...

♦ You won't see the new solar panels at Penn Farm but they will be there soon to provide power to the MSC substation. ♦ The City has asked the Trustees for \$7500 to fund an additional summer code enforcement officer for Battery Park. After much discussion approval was granted for a period of one year only - as an experiment. The trust felt that the 3 summer officers will be patrolling from Wednesday thru Sunday from 2 to 10pm. It was noted that in the past the two summer bike patrol offices were often seen riding together while it was felt they should be in different locations. Noted also that the City has brought the National Park to town and the NPS and City should be responsible for these like expenses and that the Trust was not. ♦ While we're in the Park; the issue of Carry In and Carry out came up. A proposal of **bag stations**...as seen in other State Parks was suggested for BP. One located at the Delaware Street park entrance and the other in the area of the boat club. These stations would contain biodegradable bags for dog walkers to pick up poop. Park Committee chair Chris Castagno questioned the need or the quantity of droppings. Saying he's in the Park mornings at 5:30 - 6:30 just to see for himself the litter conditions, picking up litter while there. Then the four-legged droppings changed to the feathered two-legged variety. And what can be done about that? **Teditor thinks** that perhaps some enterprising youngster could clean the plastic bags from under the kitchen sink and sell them on weekends...**a buck a bag!** The success of Tommy Wilson's Trustees Informational Meeting has the second public event in the planning stage. Tentative topic is "Committees and How They Work" and date and time will be announced soon.

While explaining the trust, Wilson described the working of a fiduciary, then referred to page six of the Blue Book (below).

Black's Law Dictionary describes a fiduciary relationship as *one founded on trust or confidence reposed by one person in the integrity and fidelity of another.* "A fiduciary has a duty to act primarily for the client's benefit in matters connected with the undertaking and not for the fiduciary's own personal interest. *Scrupulous good faith and candor are always required.*

Fiduciaries must always act in complete fairness and may not ever exert any influence or pressure, take selfish advantage, or deal with the client in such a way that it benefits themselves or prejudices the client. Business shrewdness, hard bargaining, and taking advantage of the forgetfulness or negligence of the client are totally prohibited by a fiduciary.

Pursuant to the foregoing request, William Penn, on October 31, 1701, made his warrant directing Edward Pennington, Surveyor General, to survey and lay out 1000 acres in one convenient tract for the only use and behoof of the inhabitants of New Castle, to be in common for their accommodation forever.

It will be well to carefully note Penn's language. He instructs the surveyor to survey land "hitherto reputed called New Castle Common." This would be most unusual language to employ if New Castle Common had had no prior existence.

The warrant was as follows:

WARRANT FROM WILLIAM PENN,
FOR THE SURVEY OF ONE THOUSAND ACRES OF LAND,
FOR A COMMON FOR THE USE OF THE INHABITANTS OF
THE TOWN OF NEW CASTLE, 1701.

William Penn Proprietary and Govr. of the Province of Pensilvania and annexed.
PENSILVANIA,
(L.S.)

For the accommodation of the Inhabitants of the Town of New Castle These are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyed to the only use and behoof of the said Inhabitants to lie in Common one thousand acres of the Land adjoining or near to the said Town hitherto reputed called New Castle Common in one convenient Tract, and if there prove more than the sd. number of Acres lay out the residue in one convenient piece to me and for my use and make returns thereof into my Secretaries office. Given under my hand and Seal at New Castle the 31st Day of 8ber. 1701.

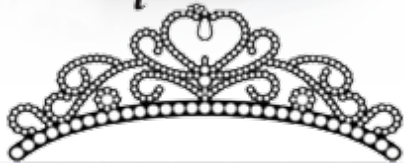

Credit for starting **Mother's Day** goes to a schoolteacher named **Anna Jarvis**. Her campaign to organize a holiday began as a way to honor the memory of her own mother, Anna Maria Reeves Jarvis. The elder Jarvis had devoted much of her life to the Andrews Methodist Episcopal Church of Grafton, West Virginia, and in May 1908, at Anna Jarvis's urging, the church held a service honoring mothers. Anna Jarvis, who lived in Philadelphia, also convinced merchant John Wanamaker to join her cause in establishing Mother's Day, and he held an afternoon service in his store. Within just a couple of years, the custom had spread to other states. At one of the first Mother's Day services, Jarvis distributed white carnations, her mother's favorite flower. Many people still follow the tradition of giving and wearing carnations on Mother's Day—white flowers in memory of deceased mothers, and brightly colored ones for living mothers ♥
