Don't ask me why these are called *Scotch Eggs*, as they're not Scottish and they don't contain whisky!

They are, however, very tasty and a unique and nutritious treat for breakfast, brunch, lunch or a snack. Use a good brand (local is best) of sausage to make these lovely Scotch Eggs. British sausage meat if you can find it.

Scotch Eggs may be eaten hot or cold, so they're perfect for packed lunches (kids love them) and picnics in Battery Park. Here's how to.

*Ingredients*1 lb sausage - 6 peeled, hard-boiled eggs ½ cup flour - 1 beaten egg - breadcrumbs - oil for frying







Shape sausage meat into flat round shapes to wrap around each egg.

Good so far? Heat oil in a pan or wok, so the eggs can be deep fried. Dip each sausage-wrapped egg in flour, then beaten egg and breadcrumbs. When oil is hot, fry each Scotch egg until golden brown, making sure to cook them long enough so that the sausage meat is fully cooked. Remove and drain on paper towel. Serve hot or cold.



#### **NGREDIENTS**

24-30 large

strawberries 1 box Strawberry

1 cup tequila

3/4 cup cointreau

Special equipment

A melon baller or small measuring spoon with relatively sharp edges

- 1. Balancing the strawberry on its side, parallel to the cutting board at the point where it is widest, cut off the top.
- 2. Still holding it the same way, cut off a tiny part of the strawberry's bottom tip so the berry can stand upright. Make sure not to cut off too much or you'll create a hole at the bottom. Repeat with all remaining strawberries.
- $3.\,Using\ a$  melon baller or small measuring spoon, carefully scoop out the insides of the strawberries.
- 4. Put them all on a baking sheet and dry them a little with a paper towel.
- 5. Combine Jell-O mix with 3/4 cup boiling water and stir 2 minutes to completely
- 6. Stir tequila and cointreau into the Jell-O mixture.
- 7. Using a container with a spout, pour Jell-O/booze mixture into strawberry cups. Fill them up as much as possible, because Jell-O shrinks when it solidifies.
- 8. Refrigerate four hours or until firm.

#### To finish

9. Zest lime into a plate of sugar.

- 10. Slice lime (you can use the same one if you don't care about the aesthetics, or a new one if you do) into thin rounds, then cut into small wedges. You may also want to cut a small chunk through the center of each wedge's flesh so they can balance on the tip of the strawberry.
- 11. Wet the sides of the solidified Jell-O shot with lime or water, roll in your sugar-lime zest, and garnish with lime wedge.

# battery park&fee\$

A large public turnout assembled at Town Hall for the Trustees of the NC Common monthly meeting last Tuesday. The recently announced fee structure for the use of the Trustee's managed Battery Park was the draw.

The fee structure was proposed by member Chris Castagno, chair of Battery Park Committee (PARK), at their April meeting. However, the actual printed notice of fees became a public document later that month. Some Trust members felt a little blindsided, learning of the fees structure from the public and not at a Trustee meeting or communiqué. Castagno said that aerating the Park after events alone cost \$1200 along with additional cost occurred in cleaning up. He stated that the fee structure (cost catcher) was modeled after State and County regulations.

Stephen Campbell, NC Hundred Lions Club president, addressed the Commissioners saying their budget couldn't sustain a \$1200 fee. He asked that Art on the Green be exempt. It wouldn't be possible to fund all they do for the City, including the Halloween Parade, scholarships, eyeglasses and the 50 plus Thanksgiving/Christmas baskets for the families in need residing in New Castle.

The Event Fee Schedule does say, "Fees for nonprofits may be waived or in-kind services provided at the discretion of the PARK or CITY".

Waivers will be considered by the Battery Park committee and reported at their June 2nd meeting. It must be noted that a member of Good Will Fire Co. was told they were in violation of regulations for lack of a permit during their Easter Egg hunt last month.

The meeting covered a variety of subjects including Committee Reports, the 2nd & Chestnut (Heyman garden) debacle, members' anniversaries, and a possible future archeological study among other items. Theresa Gormley and Alice Riehl covered the meeting at Mimi Carpenter's request. Look for their account in the WEEKLY. Mrs. Carpenter thanked the Trustees for the use of the

office to publish the WEEKLY and asked that the new owners be extended the same courtesy.
