1776 Separation Day 2017 in Historic New Castle

Grand Marshall 2017 Separation Day honors General Francis A. Vavala as Grand Marshall



Gen. Francis A. Vavala

In honor of his 50 years of service to the State of Delaware and the United States, the 2017 Separation Day Committee has chosen **General Francis A. Vavala** to be the 2017 Grand Marshall of the Separation Day Parade.

General Vavala is a retired Army National Guard officer who served as the Adjutant General of the State of Delaware. In April 2017, he was promoted to General in honor of his 50 years of service to Delaware and his country. His is the first Delaware National Guardsman to achieve the rank of four-star General.

As the Adjutant General, Gen. Vavala was responsible for managing the affairs of the Army and Air National Guard and for advising the Governor of Delaware. Vavala was in command when units of the Delaware Army and Air National Guard were integrated with active duty forces in support of Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom in Iraq, Afghanistan, Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, and Kyrgyzstan.

On the domestic front during his command, over 400 members of the Delaware National Guard were deployed for relief efforts on the Gulf Coast during Hurricane Katrina (2005) and Hurricane Gustav (2008). Gen. Vavala initiated a program entitled the "War on Hunger" in December 2008 which placed food donation sites in all Delaware Army and Air National Guard facilities as well as National Guard supported events. Food collected through this program is delivered to the Food Bank of Delaware to help feed families at risk in Delaware.

Gen. Vavala was born in Elsmere, DE. He and his wife, Jane, live in New Castle Co.


maka' da meatballs Crank up oven to 350° and line two baking sheets with parchment paper. In a large bowl, combine ground beef, bread crumbs, garlic, parsley, and crushed red pepper flakes and season with salt and pepper.

Roll into meatballs and transfer to one prepared baking sheet.

Bake until browned and cooked through, 15 minutes, then heat broiler.

maka' da soup In a large pot over medium-high heat, heat oil. Add onion and cook until soft and golden, bout 6 minutes, then add garlic and cook until fragrant...ummm, 1 minute or so. Add tomato paste and stir until combined, then add tomatoes, beef broth, and milk and stir until combined.

Add meatballs and bring to a simmer, then add half the mozzarella and all the Parmesan. Season with oregano, salt, and pepper. Ladle soup into four oven-safe ramekins and top with a baquette slice. Top with remaining mozzarella and broil until browned and bubbly, 2 to 3 minutes. Serve hot.

The New Castle City Police launched a new volunteers program in 2006 called V.I.P.S. (Volunteers in Police Service) and are searching for additional New Castle citizens interested in becoming VIPS members.

Some of the duties they will be performing are: Writing parking warnings, identifying abandoned vehicles, traffic control, house and business checks, Megan's Law sex offender notifications, residential and commercial patrol, assisting disabled motorists, clerical work, victim assistance and other duties authorized by the Department.

Volunteers will be required to reside within the corporate limits of the City of New Castle, be citizens of the United States, in good physical and mental health, possess a high school diploma or its' equivalent, be at least 21 years of age and successfully pass a background investigation.

New VIPS must complete and application and a background check is required. Also all new VIPS will have to be certified in CPR and basic first aid.

The focus of the program, which is mainly funded by a Delaware Emergency Management Citizen Corps. grant, will be to allow and enable the citizens within the corporate limits of New Castle City to be involved in the non-confrontational aspects and functions of the day to day and special event operations of the New Castle Police department. It will also enable the volunteers to become part of the law enforcement solution to some of the problems they may be experiencing in their own communities in New Castle.



Out of the Hurly-Burly or, Life in an Odd Corner



by Max Adeler (pseudonym of Charles Heber Clark)
A century ago, it was quite practical to live in a small town in northern Delaware and commute by train to Philadelphia to work. Charles Heber Clark, a 27-year-old newspaperman, tried it and got a book out of it. And a humorous book at that. In 1874, under the pen name Max Adeler, he published Out of the Hurly-Burly or, Life in an Odd Corner. The odd corner was old New Castle. The book was a huge success. The blurb on one late edition claims a million copies were printed. Even then, people were nostalgic for

a million copies were printed. Even then, people were nostalgic for the small town. Today, it is a mix of slapstick humor and a few precious glimpses of New Castle as it was 125 years ago.


There are 400 illustrations. Most are little sketches that have nothing to do with New Castle. There are, however, views of the Battery and the town's skyline that are instantly recognizable.

The humor holds up surprisingly well. In 1947, Professor August,

H. Able, III of the University of Delaware wrote that the humor was old-fashioned, unsophisticated, and involved gross exaggeration. Modern readers will find it is not much different than television sitcom humor.

Pictures of local life are scattered among funny stories that could have happened anywhere. There are descriptions of catching the train to the city, Sundays on the Battery, fishing on the Delaware, the local newspaper, and church services that probably do reflect life in New Castle. The story that the undertaker was allowed to tack permanent coffin ads on the church doors is told with too much passion to be untrue.

Adeler strays from the light side for two chapters dealing with flogging and pillory, practices he did not approve of. To bring the point home, he tells the "Delaware legend" of Mary Engle and the flogging of a women 70 years before. It is melodramatic and a bit gruesome. On the whole, however, *Out of the Hurly-Burly* is a lot of fun and a worthwhile addition to a Delaware collection. *For a great reading experience*, download the PDF






