A Day in Old New Castle



YELLOW TAPE AND PARKING PLAN

Saturday, May 21st

Closed to traffic and no parking (except for bus drop offs); the streets should be marked with yellow tape no later than Wednesday, May 18.

Delaware Street - from 4th to the wharf. Parking spots in front of the Old Court House to be reserved for unloading/loading, and additional handicapped parking, if needed.

Delaware Street in front of the Town Hall.

Second Street, from Delaware Street to Harmony Street.

Harmony Street - from 2nd to 3rd street west side only (Immanuel side), from 2nd to the The Strand, also west side only (Parish House side).

Yellow tape will remain in these locations the day of event.

East 3rd first block that abuts The Green

Market Street (the cobblestone street) both sides

The Strand, both sides, from Harmony Street to Delaware Street.

Required Handicapped parking on Delaware Street between 4th and 3rd Streets leaving 2 spaces in front of Bridgewater's Jewelers

New Castle Historical Society Executive Director, **Dan Citron**, presented the Arsenal as a visitors center. Extolling its central location, and extended hours (Wed-Sat 9:30-4:30; Sun. 11:30-4) while working with the Natl. Park Service, the goal is to offer visitors one central location for information and tickets. This will take pressure off the City Administration building staff that often is the sounding board for tourist's questions. The suggestion was made that signs be placed around town directing visitors to the Arsenal/Visitors Center.

It's Budget time again and a resolution was discussed requesting a firm commitment from the Trust to provide "funding equal to no more than \$50,000/quarter, or \$200,000 annually" for the purpose of funding Delaware Street infrastructure improvements. Rosemont House owner, Keith Adams, questioned the timing of the project...specifically the curbing issue, noting that the crumbling curb at Dalby Alley was to be addressed two years ago. 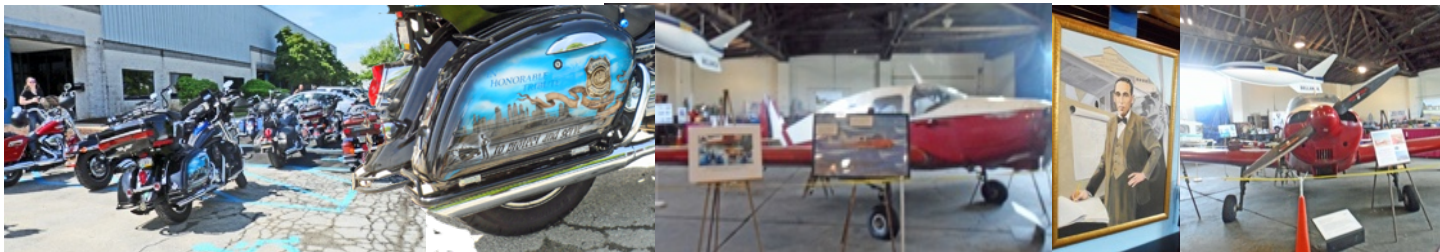

Key Lime Pies

no bake, easy, tart and sweet like
the perfect key lime pie!



Shockingly easy!

No bake. Crumble up some graham crackers, mix some cream cheese, whipped topping, key lime juice, sweetened condensed milk and BAM.

Perfection!

Gotta get at market....

3/4 cup key lime juice, fresh squeezed (about a pound of key limes or good bottled key lime juice) **Get the bottle for pete's sake!**

1 can sweetened condensed milk • 8 oz whipped topping, plus more for garnish • 8 oz cream cheese, softened • 1/2 stick butter, unsalted, melted • 1 sleeve honey graham crackers, turned into crumbs

With your easy apron on...

Crush graham crackers and mix with the butter, set aside.

Cream the cream cheese until smooth using a hand mixer, add in the sweetened condensed milk and mix until smooth. Add the key lime juice and mix until smooth. Let the whipped topping defrost and add to the cream cheese mixture, folding it in until combined.

Taking individual silicone cups (use silicone cupcake liners) fill with the cream cheese mixture about 3/4 of the way up. Top with the graham cracker crumbs. Place on platter or sheet tray and place in freezer for 4 hours or until set. Unmold pies carefully and serve graham cracker side down. The easiest way to do this is to submerge the bottom half of the mold into warm water for a few seconds.

Serve with whipped topping garnish and key lime slice and, enjoy!



Celery salt • 1.5 oz (or so) of your favorite Vodka
4 oz Clamato • 2 splashes Worcestershire
2 splashes Tabasco Sauce • Prepared horseradish, to taste
Garnish with celery

Coat the rim of a tall glass with celery salt, fill with ice and set aside.

Add the remaining ingredients to a mixing glass and fill with ice. Pour back and forth into another mixing glass a few times to mix.

Strain into the prepared glass and garnish with a celery stalk.

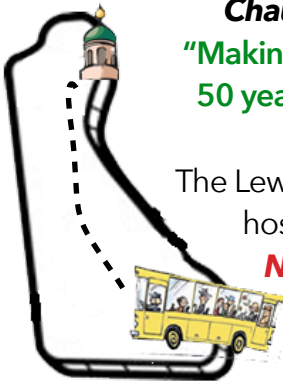

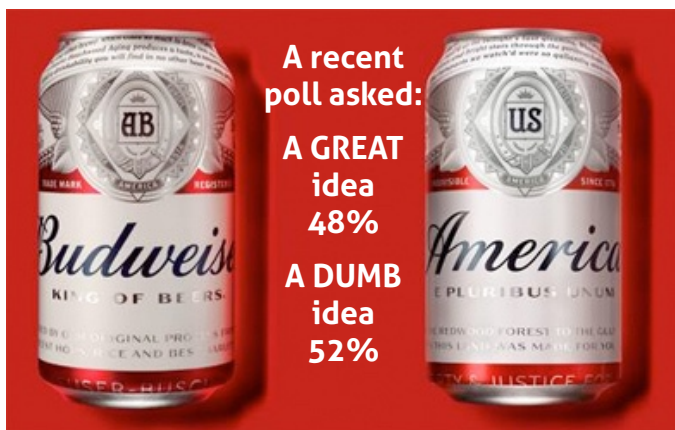

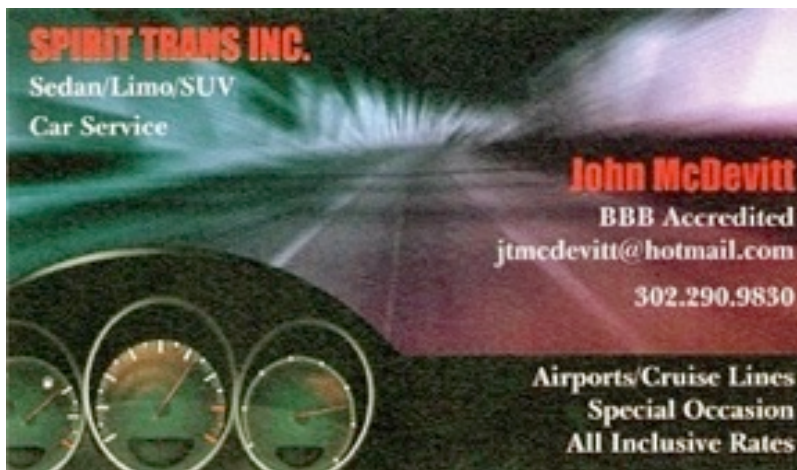
