Ever since the Trustees proposed plans for meadows to be planted in three areas around the City (see *Meadow Design and Open Space 4/12 Cobblestones*), there has been a lot of buzz over the proverbial back fence. Not bees but citizens worried about proposed insecticide, ticks, snakes and *change*. Council member Vanucci wasn't in favor of meadows or minimal mowing, "just cut the grass" was his call. Council member Megginson called for a public hearing rather than a suggested presentation by the Trustees. A public hearing may be scheduled soon. Check the City Website.

City Code provides the following:

Meadows 140-6{39} **Wildflower Meadow** Identified as such by the Director of Public Services from time to time, and native grasses, which are grown in a meadow, field, or garden, but shall not include environmentally invasive plants.

Grass Height limitation § 140-18 **Prohibited growths of weeds and grass.**

Definitions § 140-6 **Definitions.** As used in this chapter, the following words shall have the meanings indicated:

Weeds Do not include the following: **A** Ornamental shrubs and trees, provided that such ornamental shrubs and trees are maintained in good order and condition.

B A wildflower meadow; provided, however, that a wildflower meadow abutting a developed parcel shall be reasonably maintained at all times and shall be no less than 15 feet from the property line of the parcel on which such wildflower meadow is located.

Wildflower Meadow

Identified as such by the Director of Public Services from time to time, and native grasses, which are grown in a meadow, field, or garden, but shall not include environmentally invasive plants.

grilled pork kebabs

with Hoisin and Five-Spice



Preferably use natural pork, but if your pork is enhanced (injected with a salt solution), do not salt it in step

on your counter...

2 (12-oz) pork tenderloins,

trimmed and cut into 1-inch chunks - 1 tsp kosher salt

1½ tps five-spice powder* - ¾ tsp garlic powder - ½ tsp cornstarch

4½ tbsb hoisin sauce - Vegetable oil spray - 2 scallions, thinly sliced

How ya mak'em

Toss pork and salt together in large bowl and let sit for 20 minutes. Meanwhile, whisk five-spice powder, garlic powder, and cornstarch together in bowl. Add hoisin to five-spice mixture and stir to combine. Set aside 1½ tbsb hoisin mixture.

2. Add remaining hoisin mixture to pork and toss to coat. Thread pork onto four 12-inch metal skewers, leaving a ¼ inch between pieces. Spray both sides of meat generously with oil spray.

3. **FOR A CHARCOAL GRILL:** Open bottom vent completely. Light large chimney starter filled with charcoal briquettes (6 qts). When top coals are partially covered with ash, pour evenly over half of grill. Set cooking grate in place, cover, and open lid vent completely. Heat grill until hot, about 5 minutes.

4. **FOR A GAS GRILL:** Turn all burners to high, cover, and heat grill until hot, about 15 minutes. Leave primary burner on high and turn off other burner(s).

5. Clean and oil cooking grate. Place skewers on hotter side of grill and grill until well charred, 3 to 4 minutes. Flip skewers, brush with reserved hoisin mixture, and continue to grill until second side is well charred and meat registers 140°, 3 to 4 minutes longer. Transfer to serving platter, tent loosely with aluminum foil, and let rest for 5 minutes.

sprinkle with scallions and serve

*Chinese five-spice powder adds a kick that offsets richness in both sweet and savory recipes. In traditional Chinese cooking, the five elements of the cosmos—earth, fire, metal, water, and wood—are represented by five-spice powder. Most blends from China include cinnamon, star anise, cloves, fennel, and Sichuan pepper. (Companies selling five-spice powder in America substitute white or black pepper for Sichuan because for many years its import was banned due to a citrus canker.)

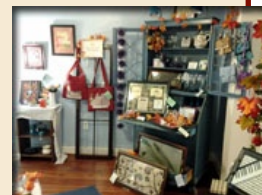

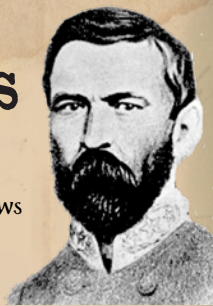

Confederate notes



May 5-10 - General Dick Taylor has surrendered to General Canby all the forces east of the Mississippi river. Everything grows darker and more hopeless. The Trans-Mississippi army, under General Kirby Smith, alone remains.

A few of us, "like drowning men catching at straws," still hope for exchange and deliverance through this source.

Dick Taylor

May 19-31 - The mortifying news of the capture of President Davis, near Washington, Georgia, is received, and the false report of his attempt to escape in female attire is circulated and maliciously harped upon by the fanatical Yankee newspapers. While I feel sure the report is totally untrue, yet I confess I think he would have been entirely justified in it, if he had sought to escape by such means. . . .

The illustrious, undaunted head of our Confederacy is a manacled prisoner. Our honored, beloved President a chained captive, his Cabinet prisoners or fugitives, our cause lost, our country ruined, our native land desolated, our gallant armies surrendered. The grand head, the noble embodiment of our holy cause, the faithful friend and servant of the South, President Davis, is now shut up in the dreary prison walls of Fortress Monroe.

On the 26th my last, fond hope was completely crushed. General Kirby Smith surrendered his forces in the Trans-Mississippi Department to General Canby at Baton Rouge. . . . What shall I do? If the alternative of banishment from the country was offered, I would unhesitatingly accept it. But it is the hated oath of allegiance or perpetual imprisonment. Both are terrible, revolting. . . .

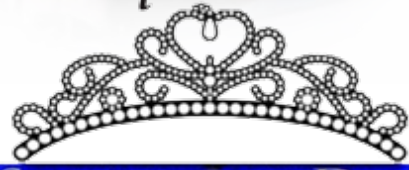

THE BOUNDARIES WE KNOW AS
HUNDREDS

The use of hundreds in America dates back to colonial days. Hundreds were used as a sub-county division in England and were introduced in some of the British colonies. For Delaware, the origin is cited as a letter written in 1682 by William Penn, the newly-appointed Lord Proprietor of the province of Pennsylvania and the counties on the Delaware. Penn directed that from this point onward, settlements be divided into sections of 100 families. The first use of the term Hundred in official records relating to the Delaware colony dates to 1687, when reference is made to "a list of taxables of north side of Duck Creek Hundred." Original hundreds: Appoquinimink - Brandywine - Christiana - New Castle - St. George's - Duck Creek - Little Creek - Mispillion all created in 1682 - Broadkill - Lewes & Rehoboth created in 1696




