For the ribs:

2 racks of pork spareribs • ½ c. of All-Purpose Red Rub • Mop Sauce

For the mop sauce:

1 c. of white vinegar - ½ c. of water - 2 tbsp veg. Oil - 2 tbsp Worcestershire - 2 tbsp All-Purpose Red Rub - Tabasco Sauce

For the red rub:

½ c. ea. Paprika, kosher salt, brown sugar, granulated garlic - 6 tbsp granulated onion -¼ c. chili powder - 1 tbsp black pepper - 1 tsp ground cumin - 1/2 tsp cayenne pepper

Make the mop sauce: Throw everything together in a saucepan and bring to a boil. Cool, pour into a plastic container, cover and refrigerate for later use.

Make the rub: Dump all the ingredients into a bowl and rub them together with your hands. Store in a plastic or glass container until ready to use.

Prepare the grill: You know how you like to fix your grill already!

Step 4: Make the ribs: Rub the ribs all over with the rub, making sure you are getting it into every surface. (You can do this

step in advance). Use just enough to coat the ribs evenly.

Grab the ribs and position them on the rack over the drip pan. Cover the grill and test its internal temperature by dropping an instantread thermometer down the vent hold. You want the grill to be from 225 to 250° Walk away from the grill and let the heat and smoke do their thing. Come back to check on the ribs in about 45 minutes. Then check on things once every hour. If the ribs are looking a bit thirsty, mop lightly with the mop sauce. If the temperature of the grill is dipping below 225°, add a few more coals to the fire. Step 5: Test the ribs: Test the ribs for doneness once they've been cooking for 3-1/2 to 4 hours. You'll know they are done if you can gently tear the meat between the bones, or poke your finger through the meat, or if they've reached an internal temperature of 180°, or if they bend nicely when you grab them in the middle with a pair of tongs. Once you've determined that they're done, get out the sauce and apply another coat.

A reprieve for the Peter Alrich/Kux House?

Earlier last week Cobblestones learned that Delaware Wild Lands has contacted the Port Penn Fire Company about getting permits to burn the Alrich/Kux House and that "DWL wants to burn it down as quickly as possible.

Many had requested a postponement so that bricks from this this 18th century historic house could be collected as artifacts. Previous offers on the part of local residents to pay for the mothballing of the house, move the house across lots to a different site, and requests that the house and plot of land be sold by Wildlands with deed and preservation restrictions were rejected by DWL.

At mid-week, Linda Beck, Executive Director of the Port Penn Historical Society said in an email message to concerned preservationists "I've just received a call from the Deputy Chief of the Port Penn Fire Company, Frank Schoeffler, who with the Chief and others in the Fire Company have made a decision that the Port Penn Fire Company will not be involved in the destruction of the historic Alrich/Kux house. After learning

about the history of the building and what it represents to our community, they want to play no part in its destruction". She praised the PPFC for their decision. However, DWL has contracted with a contractor and gotten a demolition permit from New Castle Country to demolish the house. So even if



it's not going to be burned, a contractor has been hired to demolish it.

At last Tuesday's regular City Council meeting, Council passed a resolution to review all the recommendations of the Parking Sub-Committee rather than those suggested by the Planning Commission.

Businesses located south of the City protested the new ruling of not allowing thru truck traffic on Washington Street (other than local deliveries). They sited added fuel, time, and wear on their vehicles. They said, their employees will no longer be supporting local businesses.

Russ Smith reported on the NPS Volunteer Guide Program. The "Ambassadors", now number 25, are trained to assist visitors touring the town. They can be recognized by their badges.

Toby Hagerott and his Bayberry Farm will again be selling his farm fresh offerings on Market Street next to Town Hall.

A City Code modified the definition of "Wildlife" to include feral cats.

Finally, Delaware Fish & Wildlife rep Larry Brand presented their proposed plan for the New Castle Fishing Pier to be located south of Dobbinsville. Readers shouldn't get in a tizzy about this for a while. It's a few years away from being truly considered and about two years to complete after a green light. Don't bait your hooks yet.
