'Ride Outs' pose a real danger

At the City Council meeting on March 21st, New Castle Police Captain Richard McCabe reported that large groups of children on motorized dirt bikes are gathering to ride on City streets. The police have learned that the kids are doing a "ride out". They follow a kid on internet that names a ride location for kids to show up. The public should not try to stop or interact because they have been responding with throwing rocks. **Call 911** if this activity is observed but be aware *that the police cannot chase them*. Chief Rogers told Cobblestones recently that "we haven't had any negative incident within the city with ride outs".

A resident of Baldt commented about off road vehicles being used by kids on his street at speeds he estimated to be 40-50 MPH while ignoring Stop signs. It is safety concern heightened by having kids on the street in warm weather. There were multiple police cars but they are unable to do anything. He asked the police to find a program to address the problem. President Ratchford expressed appreciation for his concerns and stated that the City will continue to research for a solution. Also, there have been groups of 5-6 kids on bicycles riding in the street, doing wheelies into oncoming traffic, laying their bikes down in front of moving cars, and have been yelling and harassing motorists as they try to pass by.

- True , I've seen him several times coming out of Collins park.
- I can recommend a great embalmer to reconstruct him when he gets crushed.
- Or a prosthetist to make him some new legs & arms.
- It has been awful on University Ave., Wilm. Manor Gardens. They are going at high rate of speed. I think they may be cutting through the woods around New Castle Middle School.

Grilled Shrimp Foil Packets



gonna need

1½ lb. large shrimp, peeled and deveined • 2 cloves garlic, minced • 2 smoked andouille sausages, thinly sliced • 2 ears corn, each cut crosswise into 4 pieces • 1 lb. red bliss potatoes, chopped into 1-in pieces • 2 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil • 1 tbsp. Old Bay seasoning • 1 lemon, sliced into thin wedges • 4 tbsp. butter kosher salt • Freshly ground black pepper
2 tbsp. chopped fresh parsley leaves

fixn' is easy

- 1 Preheat grill to high heat.
- 2 Cut 4 sheets of foil about 12" long. Divide shrimp, garlic, sausage, corn, and potatoes evenly over the foil sheets. Drizzle with olive oil. Add the Old Bay and season to taste with salt and pepper. Toss gently to combine. Top each mixture with parsley, lemon and a tablespoon of butter each.
- 3 Fold the foil packets crosswise over the shrimp boil mixture to completely cover the food. Roll the top and bottom edges to seal them closed.
- 4 Place foil packets on the grill and cook until just cooked through, about 10-15 minutes.

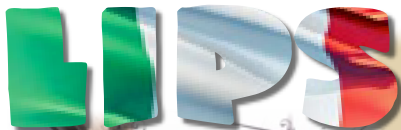

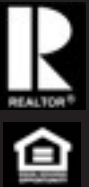
