

Separation Day In Historic New Castle, Delaware

WILLIAM T. QUILLEN

The Honorable William T. Quillen will be the 2014 Separation Day Grand Marshall. Judge Quillen was a former Delaware Supreme Court Justice and Secretary of State. In 2013, he received the Governor's Heritage Award for being the driving force behind the planning of the present Archives building in Dover.

Over the years, Judge Quillen has served as Superior Court Judge, Chancellor of the Chancery Court, and Supreme Court Justice. He has practice law in a private practice, taught law at Widener University, and written about the history

of the Delaware Court of Chancery.

Judge Quillen, a long-time resident of New Castle, has been involved in the preservation of New Castle's historic legacy, including service as a former Vice President and Director of the New Castle Historical Society. He is highly regarded for his work in preserving Delaware history.





May 29th 1916 The U.S. President's flag was adopted by executive order. It was changed by President Truman in 1945. The new flag used the same basic design



for the eagle, except (in response to some heraldic criticisms) changed the eagle to face towards its right (the direction of honor) and thus towards the olive branch, and the eagle was changed to be in full color. Instead of the four stars, a circular ring of 48 stars was added around the eagle. The only changes have been to add more stars for new states.






