4,300 degrees awarded by Wilm U

EVERYONE'S LIPS

Wilmington University awarded a total of 4,300 degrees in seven graduation ceremonies to graduates of the Class of 2016. In January, traditionally the University's largest commencement each year, 2,359 degrees were awarded. In a ceremony at the University's Georgetown location in Sussex County on May 18, 229 degrees were awarded to graduates who took classes at that site.

> On Sunday, May 22, 1,803 degrees were awarded to graduates in ceremonies at the Chase Center on the Riverfront.

> > Wilmington University's Class of 2016 is one of the largest graduating classes in the University's history. The graduates will become part of an alumni network of over 41,000 domestic and international graduates. Wilmington University total enrollment is more than 21,000 students, one third of whom take classes exclusively online.

The ceremonies at the Chase Center were streamed live over the Internet and allowed families to join the graduates on their special

day regardless of distance or ability to travel.



One-by-one they faded away; the sparse old men who I once saw selling bright red poppies on street corners and in store doorways in the week leading up to Armistice Day. They stood there quietly, bent over in misshapen overcoats, often with a scraggle of whiskers which didn't quite cover the lines in their face which seemed to me -- a ten year-old boy, in 1953 -- the visible scars of their deeply-worn lives. I remember that the poppies were



lined up in rows, neatly pinned to a square of brown cardboard, somehow reminiscent of the once-ordered ranks of fallen warriors. The crimson blossoms, each with its own silver pin, seemed like a row of little red badges, intended for adults to pin to their lapel, a paper flower that carried the arid fragrance of distant canons and the "Great War" that the aged veterans had somehow managed to survive. Now they're gone, every last one of them; the entire cadre of bright-faced boys who, in 1917, had departed from the Wilmington train station on their long journey to that bitter conflagration that was called "the war to end all wars." It makes me sad to know that they're no longer here; that I can't pause on a street corner in my old home town and buy a single poppy, a crimson one, from even one of them.

on the counter

1½ cups rice wine vinegar - 1-2 tbsps hot sauce - 1 tbsp celery seed - 1 tbsp yellow mustard seed - 1 tbsp Chinese or Dijon mustard ½ cup water - ½ cup sugar - 2 tsps salt -1 small head or half of a large cabbage, thinly sliced - ½ sm to med size red onion, very thinly sliced - 2 large cloves garlic, very thinly sliced - 1 cup fresh corn kernels - 4 Park's Finest™ Cracked Dijon Mustard Franks - 4 hot dog buns

the how-to

Pre-heat a grill or grill pan to medium-low heat.

Bring the vinegar, hot sauce, celery seed, mustard seed, mustard, water, sugar, and salt to a boil. Add the cabbage, onion, garlic and corn, and bring everything back to a boil. Then, turn off the heat.

Once the chow cools slightly, pour the mixture into a large bowl and let cool fully in the fridge while you cook the franks. It can be stored in the refrigerator for up to 2 weeks in a sealed container. Dogs on the grill and cook about 6 to 8 minutes.






Rt. 213 work on the bridge over the C&D Canal in Chesapeake City will begin on June 6th

The project will force the closure of one lane of the two-lane bridge, according to the Philadelphia District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, which has the responsibility of maintaining the bridges over the canal. A traffic light will control the flow of traffic on the bridge and it is hoped that traffic will be able to line-up part way up the bridge in one direction to shorten the wait times at the traffic light. A contractor will be repairing and painting the bridge railings.

The project will be completed in October.











