Coastal Zone Act threatened

Former Governor Russell Peterson signed the **Delaware Coastal Zone Act** into law on June 28, 1971. The Governor and General Assembly of 1971 recognized that the coastal areas of Delaware are the most critical areas for the future of the State in terms of quality of life. This law is designed to protect Delaware's coastal area, which prohibited all new development of heavy industry in a two-mile wide, 115-mile-long zone from the destructive impacts of heavy industrialization and offshore bulk product transfer facilities. The Act is intended to protect the natural environment of the coastal areas and safeguard their use primarily for recreation and tourism. The newspaper calls it "reform" ... what do you call it?

The protection our coast has enjoyed for 46 years may be modified if **H.B. 190** clears the General Assembly and signed by Governor Carney. Carefully read the proposed changes. Let our representatives in Dover know how you feel.

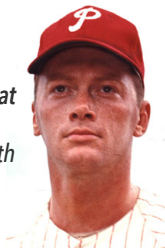

Jim Bunning has died.

Hall of Fame pitcher for the Phillies and former U.S. Senator died at the age of 85. Bunning won 224 games in a 17-year major-league career. He became the first pitcher after 1900 to throw no-hitters in both the American and National Leagues. As a member of the Phillies, Bunning pitched the seventh perfect game in Major League Baseball history on Sunday, June 21, 1964, against the New York Mets.

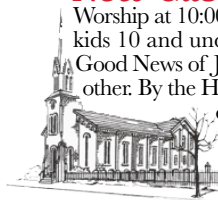

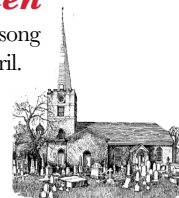

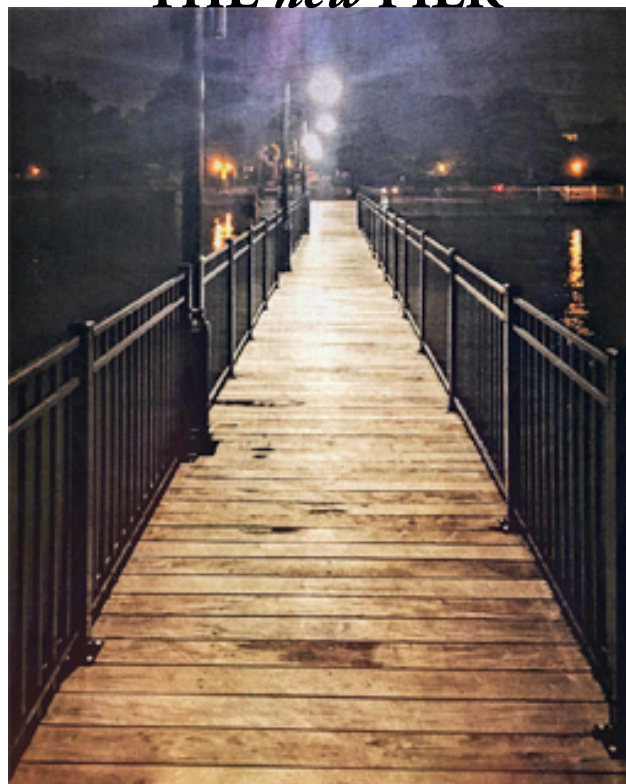

REPORT

New Castle City Police are investigating a hit and run crash that occurred on **Saturday 5/20** at approximately 6:20 PM, in the Airport Plaza shopping center. A white Jeep Cherokee struck the rear of another vehicle and then started to flee the scene.

The operator of the second vehicle attempted to stop the fleeing Jeep and was dragged for a short period of time. The subject that was dragged and a passenger in his vehicle during the initial crash were both treated at Christiana Hospital for minor injuries, and released. The fleeing vehicle is described as a **2017, white, 4 door Jeep Grand Cherokee bearing PA registration**. The operator of the fleeing vehicle is described as a black male, no further description was provided. Police are asking that anyone with information call 302-322-9800.

On **Friday 5/19** at approximately 4:30 PM New Castle City Police responded to the area of Ferry Cutoff and Chestnut Street for a hit and run crash involving a school bus. One student was on the bus at the time of the crash, but was not injured. The striking vehicle, described as a 2003 Ford Windstar, fled the scene and was located by responding New Castle City Police officers. The operator, **Jabria Ferguson (9-29-92)** was taken into custody and charged with driving under the influence of alcohol, leaving the scene of a property collision accident, failure to provide information at the scene of a property collision accident, failure to have insurance identification in possession, and failure to stop at a stop sign.
