



shoulder. They have the biggest "cap" muscle, the delicious crescent of tender, rich beef that crowns the steak.

- ▶ The bone is good. Don't cut off the bone. It keeps the meat from overcooking. Also it is good to gnaw on, or for a dog to gnaw on.
- It goes without saying that all beef should be liberally salted before grilling, but it has to be kosher salt. You can't cheat and use table salt (which will melt and mummify your steak) or sea salt (whose crunchy kernels are hard and gnarly.)
- ▶ Rib steaks should be thick enough to sear without cooking through, but not so thick that you are essentially grilling a roast beef. The ideal rib steak is about as thick as a bar of soap.
- ▶ Cook hot, over live coals, and mostly on one side. There is a school of thought that says you should be constantly flipping it. I don't belong to that school. Sear it up until it's very crusty and brown and beautiful, and then turn it over long enough for it to start cooking, about two or three minutes. Then move it over to the cold side and close the top for a couple of minutes.
- ▶ When it's done, let it sit (tent), and when you are ready to serve it, separate the cap. It's only connected by a now-melted fat seam, so you can do it with a spoon. Seriously. Serve it separately than the eye.

Have somebody bring a salad and somebody else bring beer.

You are now good to go. Summer has arrived.

Jalapeño, Blood Orange & Whiskey 1 cup fresh squeezed blood orange juice - 2 tbs Agave - 1/2

cup whiskey - 1 medium sized jalapeño, chopped, stem removed (about 2 tbs)

In a cocktail shaker, add the blood orange juice, agave and whiskey, stir until combined. Add the jalapeños, replace the shaker cap and shake three times, immediately pour through a strainer into highball

glasses filled with ice, straining out the jalapeños. Discard the jalapeños. Blood oranges, by far the best choice may be hard to find. Suggested is Tropicaña **Trop50 Red** Orange, not standard OJ.



After Separation Day, right in your own back yard...the Tall Ships Challenge Philadelphia Camden 2015 lands on both shores of the

Delaware River June 25-28.

Tall Ships Challenge is an annual event, which drifts in a three year cycle between the waters of the Great Lakes, the Pacific and the Atlantic coast.

Hundreds of thousands of visitors are expected to navigate their way to the Delaware to can catch a glimpse, step aboard and even set sail on the massive ships, which will all dock at Penn's Landing and the Camden Waterfront. Headlining the dozen-ship fleet of Tall Ships Challenge Philadelphia Camden 2015 will be L'Hermione, a replica of the 145-foot long Concorde class frigate that brought General Lafayette to the aid of the fledgling United States during the Revolutionary War.

In addition to L'Hermione, the river will be dotted with both domestic and international ships, including the 295-foot long US Coast Guard vessel Barque **Eagle**, a replica of a late -16th century Galeon warships and

Gazela - Philadelphia's official Tall Ship.


