# Suggested Protection Area Broad Dike Delaware Street Portable Wall Approx. Illustration Only- Not Planners Specifications

An update on the proposed **Coastal Protection Plan** was presented to City County and interested citizenry last Tuesday evening. Jack Roth of Duffield & Associates reported on the progress to date and systems to consider protecting against future storms and weathering related events.

Gambacorta and Broad dikes are 8 1/2' in height. FEEMA's 100-year plan calls for 9'. Add to that number a 3' wave surge would total a 12' protection barrier, which is deemed not practical.

To continue the project: 1) a 9' berm along Battery Park is proposed. First the existing walkway would have to be moved inland temporarily. The finished berm

would have the walkway on top. 2) A removable flood wall (panels) would be placed to protect Delaware Street and the wharf and 3) a protective wall on the riverside of private residences along The Strand. These panels (precast concrete one of many options) could be finished to simulate brick or stone.

Many good questions and comments were offered up from the audience. Approximate estimated costs: Battery Park \$700,000; Delaware Street \$118,000 and Private Residences \$600,000 - \$700,000. A report to Council will be made at a date to be determined.





# Resident Entry Permit

#### Information

The City will make available a temporary residential entry permit for the Separation Day Weekend. This permit will enable the police officers, police volunteers and fire police to better enforce traffic into the town and still let residents get through to their homes. Resident participation will be voluntary.

**Please note: The Entry Permit will not guarantee a parking place**, but will allow entry into the impacted area, so that residents can get to their homes.

#### Who is eligible for a permit?

Residents who live in the impacted area on streets where traffic will be "blocked" for events during the weekend.

#### How is the permit obtained?

Residents may pick up the permit card at the City office beginning June 2 through June 13.

Proof of residency will be requested.

Two (2) entry permits per household. (for example: ID with New Castle address or a utility bill in the historic area). If you cannot get to the office during business hours, email Kim Burgmuller at the City office:





## a history of New Castle's Piers & Wharfs

This article was prepared by Jane West in 1986. It was distributed to members of the "Wharf/Ice Breaker" Committee, which I served as a member. The mission of the committee was to explore the history and the possibility of restoration of the Ice Breakers.

Ira Lunt told of the lumber used as the Ice Breaker frames, where milled

and transported from his ancestors (The Lunt's) farm in Maine.

I scanned the pages and formatted the text for this reproduction. Spelling

and language style have not been changed.

The river has changed over the years and knowing the pier is a topical issue today, I hope you'll find this bit of history informative. Beginning here with installments weekly. - Teditor

Some distinction has heretofore been suggested between a wharf as a structure attached to the shore and a pier as a structure in the form of a small island erected some distance from shore and erected for the protection of navigation and shipping from the violence of storms and particularly in the winter season.

In the last decade of the 18th Century, trade in general and especially river traffic increased to a great extent. New Castle was in a very strategic position. Many, if not most, of the vessels from Philadelphia and bound for foreign ports stopped to take on livestock and other supplies for the long voyage. New Castle had its wharves but it had no piers. So in 1793 some enterprising citizen of New Castle must have conceived the idea or erecting piers--then a new ter --a. indicating a structure well beyond the wharf line which would serve the dual purpose of protection in the harbor for navigation and shipping and advancing to a large extent the trade or the town.

I presume the first difficulty which confronted those interested in the project was how the money could be obtained for the erection of the piers. In those early and naive days the idea of calling upon the Federal Government to do most of the things desired by the people had not been developed as at present. At any rate the Federal Government was then an infant only for years old and barely able to keep its financial head above the necessary debts and expenses. There was no money available from the State of Delaware and New Castle, itself, was but a straggling village with no definite bounds or organized government, and these bounds were not fix or the Town incorporated until 1797-- some three or four years later. From some source, then, came the a suggestion of a lottery for the erection of the piers.

During the Colonial period and prior to 1772, many lotteries had been held with which Delaware had, seemingly, some connection. A few were for the direct furtherance for some object in Delaware, but the majority, although either held in Delaware to which Delaware merely gave its name, were for objects outside of Delaware, and some in Colonies which, themselves, prohibited lotteries.

In 1772 Delaware recognized the evils of uncontrolled use of lotteries and prohibited all lotteries unless specially authorized by the Legislature. For 19 years after 1772 no lotteries were authorized and the State, itself, conducted the first lottery in 1791 for the building of the Kent County Court House with quarters for the use of the General Assembly. In 1794 a second lottery was authorized and this for the erection of two or more piers at New Castle. Continued next week.




