On June 15th in 1776, the Assembly of the Lower Counties of Pennsylvania declares itself independent of British and Pennsylvanian authority, thereby creating the state of Delaware.

Delaware did not exist as a colony under British rule. As of 1704, Pennsylvania had two colonial assemblies: one for the "Upper Counties," originally Bucks, Chester and Philadelphia, and one for the "Lower Counties on the Delaware" of New Castle, Kent and Sussex. All of the counties shared one governor.

Thomas McKean and Caesar Rodney, the same two men who represented the Lower Counties in the Stamp Act Congress of 1765, proposed the Lower Counties' simultaneous separation from Pennsylvania and the British crown. McKean and Rodney, along with George Read, represented the Lower Counties at the First <u>Continental Congress</u> in 1774 as well as the Second Continental Congress in 1775-76. When Read refused to vote for independence, McKean had famously summoned an ailing Rodney, who rode overnight from Dover, Delaware, to Philadelphia in order to cast his vote in favor of independence and break the Delaware delegation's stalemate.

McKean and Rodney were punished for their zealous pursuit of independence in an area heavily populated by Loyalists. The first Delaware General Assembly, a body that owed its existence to McKean and Rodney, chose not to return them to the Continental Congress in October 1776. But, after Wilmington, Delaware, and Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, fell under British occupation, the second General Assembly returned the two Patriots to the Continental Congress in October 1777. Both men went on to serve as president of the state of Delaware. Rodney held the post from March 31, 1778, to November 6, 1781. McKean served briefly as the acting president from September 22 until October 20, 1777, while George Read traveled from Philadelphia to assume the post, left vacant by John McKinly's capture by British troops.



It's time for Delaware to celebrate being ahead of the Colonial pack, independence-wise. That and not being Pennsylvania, no offense. This Saturday, Separation Day in New Castle commemorates Delawareans' vote for independence - from England as well as Pennsylvania and its ruling family of William Penn - well ahead of the Fourth of July in 1776. The Colonial Assembly of what were then the Lower Counties of Pennsylvania met on June 15, 1776, at the Old Court House in New Castle. There, they voted to form "The Delaware State." What would become the other dozen original states were in the process of developing provisional governments in advance of the expected vote for Independence by members of the Continental Congress in Philadelphia. But Delaware, as Delawareans say, was first.



Admission from noon-5 pm: \$10; Everyone under 21 gets free admission! There is no admission charge after 5 pm. With admission, adults 21 and older (proof of ID required) will receive a drink ticket entitling them to one alcoholic beverage (a 16oz beer, a glass of wine, or a specialty cocktail) or two bottles of water.

Wristbands are \$10 for unlimited access to Rides & Attractions. Live bands will be performing noon to 9:30pm.

The festival culminates with a spectacular fireworks display over the Delaware River beginning approximately 9:30pm.


