The New Castle Court House Museum at 211 Delaware St. in New Castle, is now open for visitation seven days a week between June 1st, and Sept. 30th., 2014. Hours:



Mon. to Sat., 10 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.; and Sun., 1:30 to 4:30 p.m. The museum will also be open between 10 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. on the following state holidays: Independence Day (Friday, July 4, 2014) and Labor

Day (Monday, Sept. 1, 2014). For additional information about visiting the museum, call 302-323-4453.

Funding for the expanded schedule was provided by the federal government as part of an agreement between the National Park Service, which manages the First State National Monument, and the Delaware Division of Historical and Cultural Affairs, which First State

manages the New Castle Court House Museum. The agreement seeks to collaboratively

promote the preservation, interpretation and public use of the court house; and to expand its days of operation so that they conform with the park service's policy of keeping its

units open seven days a week during the summer. The museum is normally closed on Mondays, Tuesdays and state holidays.

Original recipe makes 9 appetizers <u>Change Servings</u> 18 slices bacon

1 ½ cups cherry tomatoes, halved1 head butter lettuce - rinsed, and torn1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese (optional)

Here's How....Preheat the oven to 375°

Turn two muffin tins upside down, and cover the outside of 9 cups with aluminum foil. Set aside.

Weave the bacon into a mat that is 9 strips across and 9 strips wide. Cut into 9 even squares. Place each square over one of the foil covered muffin cups.Bake the bacon in the preheated oven until crisp, about 10 minutes. Remove the bacon cups from the pan and allow to cool completely.

Once cooled, fill each with some lettuce and tomato halves. Top with shredded Cheddar (Teditor sez Blue) cheese.



is a form of Caipirinha prepared with vodka instead of the usual cachaça. It is a popular cocktail in Brazil, Uruguay and Argentina. Although the "proper" way to make a Caipiroska is a matter of quite varied opinion, this is the basic recipe:

2 oz vodka • ½ lime, cut into wedges • 1 tsp brown sugar • 1 tsp raw or turbinado sugar • Crushed ice Use an old fashioned or highball glass.

Squeeze juice from lime wedges into the glass. Place one of the lime wedges into the glass and add sugars. Muddle sugar with the lime wedges. Be careful not to overdo the muddling of the lime rind as it may introduce too much of the essential oils from the lime and make the drink too bitter. Pour in vodka and stir well until the sugar is dissolved. Add crushed ice and stir to melt some of the ice. Garnish with lime slice or wedge and serve.

# Separation Day Resident Entry Permit

#### Information

The City will make available a temporary residential entry permit for the Separation Day Weekend. This permit will enable the police officers, police volunteers and fire police to better enforce traffic into the town and still let residents get through to their homes. Resident participation will be voluntary.

Please note: The Entry Permit will not guarantee a parking place,

but will allow entry into the impacted area, so that residents can get to their homes.

#### Who is eligible for a permit?

Residents who live in the impacted area on streets where traffic will be "blocked " for events during the weekend.

#### How is the permit obtained?

Residents may pick up the permit card at the City office beginning June 2 through June 13.

Proof of residency will be requested.

Two (2) entry permits per household. (for example: ID with New Castle address or a utility bill in the historic area). If you cannot get to the office during business hours, email Kim Burgmuller at the City office:

# a history of New Castle's Piers & Wharfs

This article was prepared by Jane West in 1986. WEEK 2. - Teditor

The Act of February 7, 1794, by its preamble, recognized that the piers were for the safety of navigation and authorized a lottery to raise \$12,000. to erect two or more piers; it appointed as Managers John Stockton, William Lees, James Riddle, Kensey Johns, Isaac Grantham, Archibald Alexander and George Read, Jr. The Act provided for the drawing of the lottery and provided that any prizes not claimed within six months would be forfeited and used for the purpose of the lotery. This was important provision because, as will be seen, some \$3,558.51 of unclaimed prizes were forfeited and added to the fund for the erection of the piers.

In those days the Managers would publish the "scheme" of the lottery indicating the number of tickets to be sold, the number and amount of the various prizes to be won and the number of "blanks" drawing no prize. Fortunately, we know exactly the details of such "scheme". An ordinary and common method of operating a lottery was to distribute the entire proceeds of the lottery as prizes, and to deduct from the winners the amount of 15% of the prizes which constituted the amount to be devoted to the purposes of the lottery. This was the procedure adopted by the Managers of the New Castle Pier Lottery on May 3, 1794, as appears by their advertised scheme.

#### A Lottery

Authorized by an Act or the Legislature of the State of Delaware at the late session for the raising a sum of money to erect piers in the River Delaware off the Town of New Castle, for the better security of vessels navigating that River at certain seasons or the year. Dollars

The above scheme of the New Castle Pier Lottery affords a favorable opportunity to persons disposed to adventure in lotteries as there are many large prizes and not two blanks to a prize--A, and it is designed to answer a public and very important purpose, the managers presume to solicit the public patronage in the sale of the tickets. The managers being induced to hope that the sale of the tickets from the laudable object of the lottery will be very rapid, entertain no doubt but that the drawing will commence and be completed at a very early period of the present year. Extract from the Minutes of the Board of Mangers,

George Read, Jr., Secretary dated New Castle, May 13, 1794. The sale of the lottery tickets was somewhat delayed but finally was accomplished before February 25, 1795 for the drawing of the lottery commenced on that date.

The manner of drawing a lottery may be without some interest. Three sets of identically numbered tickets were printed. One of these sets was sold, the tickets of the second set were separately rolled as billets and placed in the lottery box, and the third set was kept for checking purposes. Two sets of prize tickets were prepared indicating their respective values which, with the "blanks" correspond to the number of tickets sold. One of these sets was rolled and placed in a second lottery box and the other kept for checking purposes. Both lottery boxes were sealed.

When the tickets had been sold, a day for the drawing was set and publicly announced and the Managers opened the boxes and drew tickets simultaneously from each box. The tickets taken from the first box were awarded the prizes (if any) indicated on the ticket drawn from the second box, and this was continued until the prize tickets were exhausted. This drawing of the tickets involved much

time and labor depending on the number of tickets drawn each day. The drawing often consumed many weeks or months. We know that the drawing of the New Castle Pier Lottery commenced on February 25, 1795 and ended on June 2nd. This method of drawing lotteries continued until about October 18, 1823 when Joseph Vannini received a patent on the so-called "Ternary System" by which it was said a lottery could be drawn in fifteen minutes.


A tantalizing thought suggests itself as to how the Treasurer or Manager took care of the money received for the tickets. There were no banks in the State and the care of the amount of cash must have presented a serious problem. The lottery was to produce \$80,000. All this sum was not paid in cash before the drawing for we know that many tickets were represented by promissory notes, but these must have been confined to purchasers of good credit. Many must have been paid in cash. We know that an employee of one of the Managers had one or more tickets and it seems reasonably certain that he must have paid in cash.

The losing tickets or "blanks" must produce \$52,900. (10,580 "blanks" at \$5.), and many of these after drawing would not be paid unless secured. The deduction of 15% could be made from the winning tickets but these would only produce \$27,100. (5,420 tickets at \$5.).

While we know the winner of each prize, we know it only by the number of the ticket; do not know the name of any winner, save one. We know that ticket No. 11139 won the prize of \$10,000. and ticket No. 2907 won a prize of \$5,000., but we do not know the names of the fortunate winner. The one exception, so far as 1 know appears in a memorandum book of George Read (one of the Managers) where, under date of August 19, 1795 it appears that he received from an employee of his \$25. prize money of the New Castle Pier Lottery and which he had afterwards returned. The Firm of Rumsey & Broom, merchants of Wilmington, was the authorized agent to report the daily drawings and the public was cautioned to rely on no other.

Notwithstanding this caution, several tavern keepers in New Castle including John Crow advertised the dally drawings.

June 15<sup>th</sup> of 1776 was a momentous date for the citizens of the Three Lower Counties of Pennsylvania (Delaware colony). On that day the Colonial Assembly took the drastic step of proclaiming the little colony separate and independent from Great Britain and the free from any ties with Penn family and Pennsylvania.
