Water Main relining project *almost done!*

9th Street Water Main Replacement

The water main replacement start date has been moved to June 19th (due the weather delays and scheduling conflicts)

Dobbinsville Cleaning and Lining

All water services have been restored to the cleaned and lined mains.

Blacktop patching is complete for 600 & 700 Block of Clymer Street and 700 Block of Clark Street

Clark Street Water Main Replacement

There will be street closures and parking restrictions this week for the entire length of Clark Street while work is continued on the water services.

Due to weather issues and some homes having services which could not be connected to the new system without some replacement the project has went slower than anticipated.

Blacktop patching is expected the week of June 12th.

All dates are contingent upon the weather as rain/showers.

Final paving is being coordinated with New Castle County engineers as they performed sewer work in this area previously.

There are only 4 ingredients for the pie and it is ready to go in the freezer in about 5 minutes. SO easy! The hardest part about this recipe is waiting on it to set up in the freezer!

Best to use fresh key limes. If you can find key limes, you can use a bottle of key lime juice or regular limes/lime juice. Either will be fine. Also use a store bought graham cracker crust. It works great in this recipe.

Only need 4 things

1 store-bought graham cracker crust

2 cups heavy cream

1 (14oz) can sweetened condensed milk

12 key limes, (3 zested, 12 juiced)

... and 2 easy steps

- 1 Whip heavy cream until stiff peaks. Fold in sweetened condensed milk, zest of 3 key lime, and juice from all 12 key limes.
- 2 Spread whipped cream mixture into graham cracker crust. Cover with plastic wrap and place in freezer. Freeze for 6 hours, or until set. Key Limes are different from regular limes. They are much smaller! If you can't find key limes, you can substitute 4 regular limes. Zest 1 and juice 4 for this recipe.

1 1/2 oz. strawberry-infused aged white rum 3/4 oz. fresh lemon juice 1/2 oz. vanilla liqueur 1/2 oz. simple syrup 1/2 oz. milk 1 fresh egg white Club soda Combine all ingredients, except the club soda, and shake hard with ice. Strain into a chilled glass and top with tonic.

Strawberry-infused rum: Hull and quarter 1 pint of fresh strawberries and combine with 1750-ml. bottle if aged white rum. Let infuse for at least 24 hours, tasting occasionally until desired flavor is reached.

The New Castle City Police launched a new volunteers program in 2006 called V.I.P.S. (Volunteers in Police Service) and are searching for additional New Castle citizens interested in becoming VIPS members.

Some of the duties they will be performing are: Writing parking warnings, identifying abandoned vehicles, traffic control, house and business checks, Megan's Law sex offender notifications, residential and commercial patrol, assisting disabled motorists, clerical work, victim assistance and other duties authorized by the Department.

Volunteers will be required to reside within the corporate limits of the City of New Castle, be citizens of the United States, in good physical and mental health, possess a high school diploma or its' equivalent, be at least 21 years of age and successfully pass a background investigation.

New VIPS must complete and application and a background check is required. Also all new VIPS will have to be certified in CPR and basic first aid

The focus of the program, which is mainly funded by a Delaware Emergency Management Citizen Corps. grant, will be to allow and enable the citizens within the corporate limits of New Castle City to be involved in the non-confrontational aspects and functions of the day to day and special event operations of the New Castle Police department. It will also enable the volunteers to become part of the law enforcement solution to some of the problems they may be experiencing in their own communities in New Castle.

These pots must be marked with all white buoys with the owner's full name and permanent mailing address inscribed either on the buoy or on a waterproof tag attached to the buoy. All crab pots must be tended at least once every 72 hours."

An Immigrant's Journey

Between 1892 and 1954 twelve million immigrants entered the U.S. through Ellis Island alone. Today, descendants of those immigrants account for almost half of the population of the U.S.

On Saturday, June 17th from 1-3pm, the Delaware History Museum invites

families to envision the lives of 19th century immigrants. The family program, asks guests to contemplate what it must have been like for immigrants to leave their homes and make a long journey by sea to a new country where the language and customs were new.

Three hands-on stations allow participants to consider what 19th-century immigrants would pack in a bag for a long voyage and to identify everyday

objects that would help a newcomer to better understand American culture versus objects that represent Old World customs and traditions.

Program fee is included with museum admission. Adults \$6, Seniors (65+)/Military/Student (with i.d.) \$5 and Children (3-18) \$4

"OLD GLORY!"




The original "Old Glory" owned by sea captain William Driver

This famous name was coined by Captain William Driver, a shipmaster of Salem, Massachusetts, in 1831. As he was leaving on one of his many voyages aboard the brig CHARLES DOGGETT - and this one would climax with the rescue of the mutineers of the BOUNTY - some friends presented him with a beautiful flag of twenty four stars. As the banner opened to the ocean breeze for the first time, he exclaimed "Old Glory!" He retired to Nashville in 1837, taking his treasured flag from his sea days with him. By the time the Civil War erupted, most everyone in and around Nashville recognized Captain Driver's "Old Glory." When Tennessee seceded from the Union, Rebels were determined to destroy his

flag, but repeated searches revealed no trace of the hated banner.

Then on February 25th, 1862, Union forces captured Nashville and raised the American flag over the capital. It was a rather small ensign and immediately folks began asking Captain Driver if "Old Glory" still existed. Happy to have soldiers with him this time, Captain Driver went home and began ripping at the seams of his bedcover. As the stitches holding the quilt-top to the batting unraveled, the onlookers peered inside and saw the 24-starred original "Old Glory"!

Captain Driver gently gathered up the flag and returned with the soldiers to the capitol. Though he was sixty years old, the Captain climbed up to the tower to replace the smaller banner with his beloved flag. The Sixth Ohio Regiment cheered and saluted - and later adopted the nickname "Old Glory" as their own, telling and re-telling the story of Captain Driver's devotion to the flag we honor yet today. Captain Driver's grave is located in the old Nashville City Cemetery, and is one of three (3) places authorized by act of Congress where the Flag of the United States may be flown 24 hours a day.
