Summer begins Saturday and Battery Park sees more usage than at any other time of year. Since the Trustees assumed the care and maintenance of the Park, no other program has caused more sidewalk and gathering place controversy than the removal of the blue barrels for litter. The introduction of the **Carry In - Carry Out**

Program for trash/litter disposal is a favorite topic bout the town. For the last twenty years the State Park system has found this "Visitors now take their trash with them when they leave" program an overwhelming success, saying "Your continuing cooperation means cleaner parks for everyone".

These pictures show an example from the yesteryear and last Wednesday afternoon. One reoccurring question



among residents bordering the Park is that when visitors take their trash with them, where do they dispose of it? City corner trash cans seem inadequate and many residents report of bags of trash on sidewalks and other nooks and crannies.

SUNDAY-JUNE 20, 1819

SS Savannah, a 330 ton ship, 98 feet and 6 inches in length, with a beam of 25 feet 2 inches, and drawing 12 feet and 1 inch, had been fitted with both sails and a 90 Horse Power engine and boiler. On the 22nd of May in 1819, she sailed out of the port of Savannah, Georgia, commanded by Moses Rogers, to commence the first historic crossing of the Atlantic Ocean by a steamship. She made it to Liverpool, England on the 20th. of June, using her engines on 18 days of her epic journey.


A total of 606 swimmers successfully completed the course. Unfortunately, one swimmer lost his life attempting to complete the







One tavern keeper, William Armstrong, who kept a tavern adjoining the old "Tile House" under the name of "Ship and Plow" advertised as follows:

"as some of neighbors and brother Chips in town are improving the opportunity of vending GROG in consequence of the influx of visitors into this place I think as a freeman I am entitled to the same privilege and therefore beg leave to inform the public that accounts of each days drawing of the New Castle Pier Lottery may be obtained gratis and a glass of GROG into the bargain provided it is paid for".

After the sale of the tickets had been reasonably assured, the Managers seem to have acted very promptly in making a contract with Antria Conarrae for the building of the two piers. We do not know the date of the contract but we do know the location of the piers. One was at the foot of what is now called Harmony Street (then called Mary Street) and the other at the foot of Delaware Street. One of the two piers was put in place September 26, 1795, as appears in this note in the issue of the Philadelphia Dally Advertiser of October 2, 1795:

"On Saturday the 26th ult. 'the Artificers employed in erecting the Piers at New-Castle, proceeded, with ANTRIM COMMDROE, the Contractor, and a Committee of the Manages of the Pier Lottery, and sunk the first Pier, fifty feet in length, and thirty in breadth, in the depth of water of twenty feet, at low water. Everything was conducted with the greatest regularity and order, and no misfortune or accident damped their spirits, or retarded the work. It is intended to compleat a second Pier this season, which will afford a temporary and tolerable secure harbour for vessels in time of ICE.'"

It is not clear from the account whether this pier put in place was at Harmony Street or Delaware Street, but it would seem from matters subsequently appearing that the first pier erected or "sunk" was off Delaware Street. Neither pier seems to have been satisfactory. Within five years Kensey Johns (who was Treasurer of the New Castle Pier Lottery) entered into a contract with Richard Sexton and Henry Rowen (both residents of New Castle) for the repair of the pier off Harmony Street and of the "sunken pier" off Delaware Street. Since the original pier in its installation is said to have been "sunk", it is not entirely clear whether the term "sunken pier" has reference to its condition or the method of its installation, but it is significant that while repairs are to be made to both it is only the one at Delaware Street that is called the "sunken pier".

While the managers of the lottery were very prompt in building the piers, they were not prompt in making a report as required by the Act of Assembly. In 1799 some 41 prominent citizens petitioned the Legislature to require a report. The petition stated that two piers had been built at a cost of 2100 pounds but no report had been made. An Act requiring a report was duly passed but the time limited had expired and another Act was passed requiring a report.


