# maple-bacon chocolate chip **COORIES**

"This recipe was born out of a challenge to include bacon in a cookie batter. While that has been done before, the inclusion of chocolate chips and maple together in a whipped batter make this a sweet-yet-savory chewy cookie treat!" – <u>Mike Tarage</u>"

### ingredients

- Recipe makes 24 cookies
- 2 c.s all-purpose flour
- 1 tsp baking powder 1 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 c. butter, room temperature
- 3/4 c. packed brown sugar
- 3/4 c. white sugar
  - 2 eggs
    - 1 tsp vanilla extract 1 tsp maple extract 1/3 c. chopped cooked bacon 1 c. bittersweet chocolate chips

#### directions

1. Preheat an oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Line 2 baking sheets with parchment paper. Whisk together the flour, baking powder,

baking soda, and salt; set aside.

- 2. Beat together the butter, brown sugar, and white sugar with an electric mixer until smooth. Add one egg; beat until blended into the butter mixture. Add the remaining egg, vanilla extract, and maple extract; beat until well blended and slightly fluffy. Stir in the flour mixture a little at a time, mixing just until combined. Stir in the bacon and chocolate chips. Scoop by rounded tablespoonfuls onto prepared cookie sheets.
- 3. Bake in the preheated oven until edges turn golden brown, 10 to 12 minutes. Remove from the oven, and cool on a wire rack.




# Wednesday, June 26, 6:00pm

#### **Did You Know?**

- The most popular cheese recipe is the United States is "macaroni and cheese."
- There are over 2,000 varieties of cheeses.
- Cheese takes up about 1/10 the volume of the milk it was made from
- A giant wheel of Cheddar cheese was given to Queen Victoria (1837-1901) for a wedding gift. It weighed over 1,000 pounds. A normal Cheddar wheel weighs 60-75 pounds.

#### **Serving & Storage Tips**

- Unpasteurized cheese with a range of flavors should not be sliced until purchase otherwise it will start to lose its subtlety and aroma.
- Keep the cheese in conditions in which it matures. Hard, semi-hard and semi-soft cheeses are stored in the temperatures from around 8 - 13 C.
- Keep the cheese wrapped in the waxed paper and place it in a loose-fitting food-bag not to lose humidity and maintain the circulation of air.Wrap blue cheeses all over as mould spores spread readily not only to other cheeses but also to everything near.
- Chilled cheeses should be taken out of the refrigerator one and a half or two hours before serving.
- Cheeses contain living organisms that must not be cut off from air, yet it is important not to let a cheese dry out.
- Do not store cheese with other strongsmelling foods. As a cheese breathes it will absorb other aromas and may spoil.
- Wrap soft cheeses loosely. Use waxed or greaseproof paper rather than cling film.
- Let cold cheese warm up for about half an hour before eating to allow the flavor and aroma to develop.


