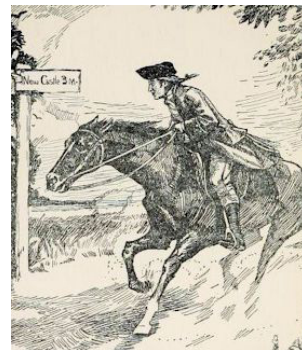
A Family Program HOORAY FOR INDEPENDENCE DAY

Children can learn how to drill like a continental soldier and make a 4th of July theme craft. Guests are welcome to further explore the history of the First State by touring *Delaware: One State, Many Stories*, a comprehensive exhibition presented in a complementary dual format. *Discover Delaware* introduces a general overview of the state's history from the 1600s to the present. *Journey to Freedom* features the history of African Americans, from the first known African brought to Delaware by the Swedes in the 1600s called "Black Anthony," to Delaware Poets Laureate, brothers Nnamdi Chukwuocha and Al Mills.

would be infinitely better if every bite of eggs included bacon. Well, Cobbles, let's make that dream a reality with this bacon-wrapped egg cup recipe.

MAKES 4 SERVINGS (8 BAKED EGGS)



YOU'LL NEED

16 bacon strips
8 eggs
Salt and freshly ground black pepper

EASY HOW TO...

- 1 Preheat the oven to 400°F. Line a baking sheet with aluminum foil, then arrange the bacon on it.
- 2 Bake the bacon until the fat has begun to render and the strips are partially cooked. Cool until it's cool enough to touch.
- 3 In the muffin tin, line the perimeter of one cup with 2 bacon strips. Repeat with the remaining strips of bacon until you have prepared eight cups.
- 4 Crack an egg into each bacon-lined cup. Season with salt and pepper. Place the muffin tin in the oven and bake until the egg whites are set and the yolks are still jiggly, 10 to 12 minutes. The bacon should be very crispy.
- 5 Run a paring knife around the edge of each bacon cup to help release it from the pan. *Serve warm with scrapple and home fries.*

4 cups water, divided
1 cup sugar
1 cup raspberries
Four 3-inch pieces lemon zest
2 mint sprigs
Pinch kosher salt
2 cups freshly squeezed lemon juice
1 cup vodka
Ice, for serving



here's how

- In a small saucepan, combine 1 cup of the water with the sugar, raspberries, lemon zest, mint and salt. Bring to a simmer and cook until the sugar has dissolved and the raspberries have broken apart, 2 minutes. Remove from the heat and let cool completely, then strain into a pitcher.
- Add the remaining 3 cups of water, the lemon juice, vodka and ice. Stir until well chilled, then serve.

Community Garden Framework

At this point, the basic framework is a community garden for veterans:

- * Gardens would begin in 2018 growing season. They will be located at the Historic Penn Farm in New Castle, DE, which is managed by Delaware Greenways. Click [HERE](#)
- * We would work with Delaware Greenways to develop an agreement about garden preparation, management, operation and maintenance * We can have 2 types (sizes) of plots. A smaller size for veterans who want to garden for themselves and family, and a larger size for veterans who are thinking about agriculture and would like to try production on a pilot scale. * We have discussed donating some amount of produce from each plot to a food pantry, or military families in need. This would be decided by the core group who will help us get started. * In addition to Delaware Greenways, New Castle, Delaware we have a wide network of resources to assist gardeners, from the DE Urban Food and Farm Coalition to the Dept. of Agriculture. There are startup grants, small but powerful, to get the project moving forward.

We need Gardeners and Supporters of the Community Garden project that would be placed on the property of Penn Farm.

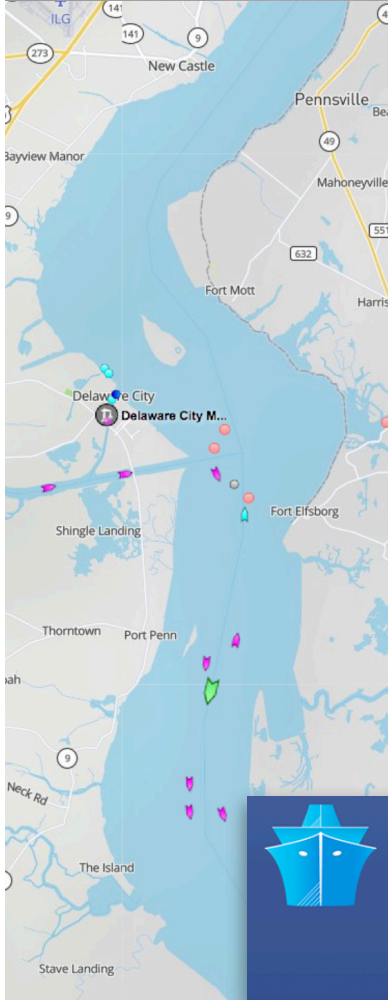

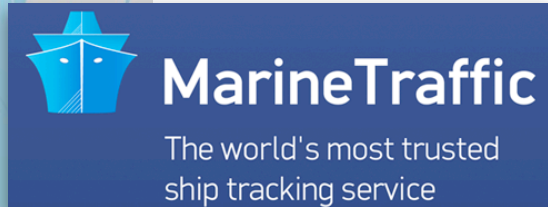
