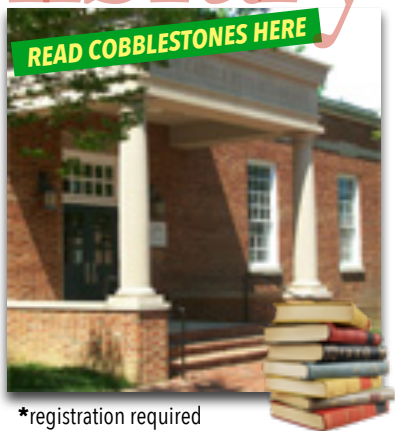

Note: This recipe calls for a large chicken. Do not try it with a smaller chicken, as it will dry out too much while cooking.

Smoky barbecue chicken with perfectly juicy meat and a sweet, sticky glaze.

ya gotta have...

1 whole large chicken, about 6 to 8 pounds
1 tbsp kosher salt • 1 tbsp brown sugar • 1 tsp black pepper • 1 tsp chili powder • 1 tsp ground coriander seed • 2 medium cloves garlic, minced • 2 cups your favorite BBQ sauce • 2 chunks hardwood, soaked in water for 30 minutes

here's how...

▶ Pat chicken dry with paper towels and place breast-side-down on a large cutting board. Using sharp kitchen shears, remove the backbone. Turn chicken over and lay out flat. Press firmly on breast to flatten the chicken. For added stability, run a metal or wooden skewer horizontally, entering through one thigh, going through both breast halves, and exiting through the other thigh. Tuck wing tips behind back. Season generously with salt and pepper.

▶ Combine salt, brown sugar, black pepper, chili powder, coriander seed, and garlic in a small bowl and massage with fingertips until homogenous. Spread mixture evenly over all surfaces of chicken.

▶ Light one chimney full of charcoal. When all the charcoal is lit and covered with gray ash, pour out and spread the coals evenly over half of coal grate. Alternatively, set half the burners of a gas grill to high heat. Set cooking grate in place, cover grill and allow to preheat for 5 minutes. If using charcoal, place hardwood chunks directly on coal. If using gas, place on grate above lit burners.

▶ Place chicken skin side up over cooler side of grill with legs pointed towards hotter side. Close grill and cook until center of thickest part of chicken registers 120°F on an instant read thermometer, 35 to 45 minutes. Brush top of chicken with barbecue sauce. Cover and continue cooking for 5 minutes until sauce is beginning to dry. Brush with more sauce, cover, and continue to cook for until thickest part of breast registers 135°F on an instant read thermometer, about 5 minutes longer. Using tongs and a flexible metal spatula, carefully flip the bird and place it skin side-down directly over the coals. Brush back of chicken with more sauce. Continue to cook, covered, until brown, crisp, charred in spots, and thickest part of breast registers 150°F on an instant read thermometer, 7 to 10 minutes longer. If bird threatens to burn before temperature is achieved, carefully slide to cooler side of grill, cover, and cook until done. Remove from grill, let rest 10 minutes, carve, and serve.

CucumberGin Spritz

You'll need to serve 4

1 English hothouse cucumber - 4 ounces gin
2 ounces simple syrup - 16 ounces dry Prosecco or other sparkling white wine - Club soda

How to...

Using a vegetable peeler, shave 12 long, thin ribbons from cucumber; set aside. Cut a 6" piece from remaining cucumber and cut into small pieces. Muddle in a cocktail shaker, then add gin and simple syrup and fill shaker with ice. Cover and shake vigorously until outside of shaker is frosty, about 30 seconds. Strain mixture into 4 ice-filled rocks glasses or large wine glasses. Top each with 4 oz. Prosecco and a splash of club soda. Gently stir together; garnish each with 3 cucumber ribbons

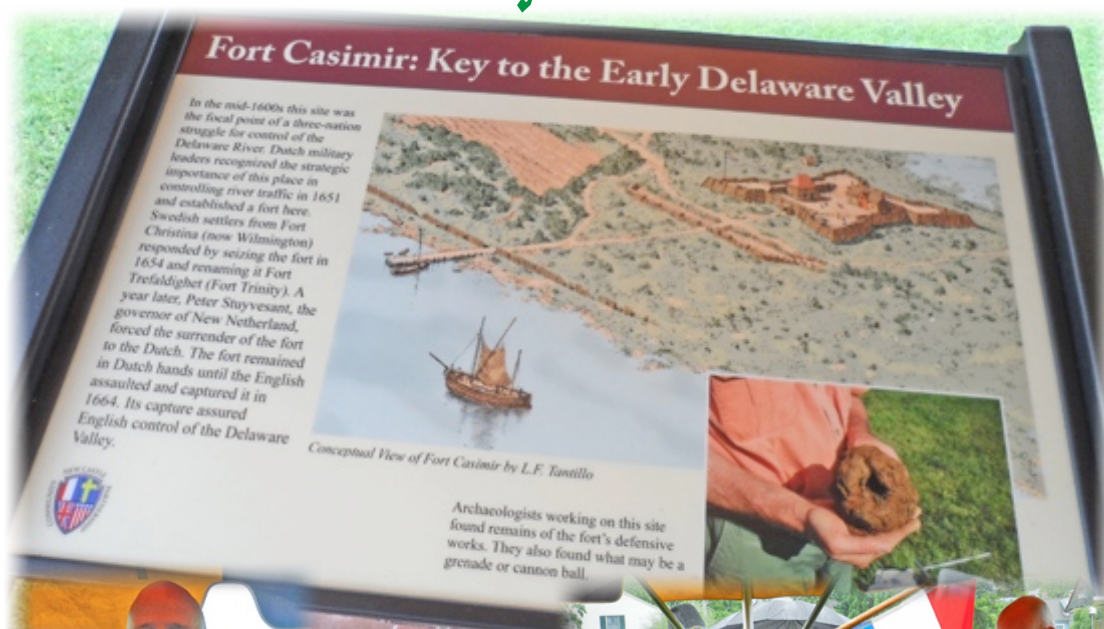
Fort Casimir Wayside exhibit unveiling



The NPS has awarded the New Castle Historical Society the ABBP grant of \$71,500 for archeology at Fort Casimir.

This project will identify and delineate the boundaries of the Fort Casimir Battlefield as well as determine the extent of subsurface remains of both the fort and related sites in the surrounding area. The fort was built in present-day New Castle by the Dutch in 1651 and was the site of a decisive battle between the Dutch and English in 1664 that helped establish English control of the Delaware Valley. Conducting ground penetrating radar and select subsurface testing will help locate any artifacts. A final report will be distributed to the public and used to develop future educational materials.

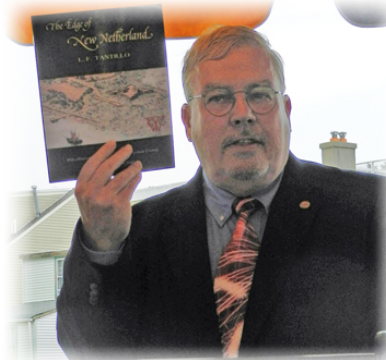
