



## ITALIAN NOT DOGS

These are the absolute best hot dogs I've ever had. Serving size depends on how many dogs you want to make.

Here's for 1 serving, you take it from there.

#### gonna need

1 hot dog ★ 2 tbsp canola oil ★ 1 med potato ★ salt ★ pepper ★ 1 small onion, sliced ★ 1 green bell pepper ★ spicy mustard ★ 1 steak/sub roll

#### directions

Grill hot dog. Wash peel and cube potato. Toss potato in oil, season with salt - pepper. Sauté potatoes until fork tender

Sauté onion and pepper until tender. Place your hot dog in roll. Top with spicy

mustard, potatoes, peppers and onions. enjoy



This recipe originally was supposed to use Kraft's Cheese dogs but you can use whatever type of hot dog you'd like.

#### gonna need Servings 6

6 hot dogs ★ 6 hot dog buns, partially split, toasted lightly ★ 1/4 c iceberg lettuce, shredded ★ 1/4 cup tomatoes, chopped ★ 4 cup red onion, chopped ★ 1/2 cup buttermilk ranch dressing ★ 1/4 cup bacon, cooked drained and crumbled

#### directions

Grill the hot dogs until they are heated through, turning occasionally. Assemble The hot
dog starting with the toasted bun and adding the shredded Lettuce. Next add the onions
and tomatoes. Place the hot dog on top of the onions and tomatoes. Drizzle with 1 Tbsp of
the ranch dressing and top with crumbled bacon. enjoy

Really really easy and yummy! You don't need to follow an exact recipe for this, but I thought I'd put the idea out there!

#### gonna need Servings 1

1 hot dog (I prefer Ball Park) ★ 1 slice American or Sharp Cheddar cheese ★ ½ small flour tortilla

#### It takes an average of 600 grapes to make a bottle of wine.

Winesin

Wow! With that being the case, it's no wonder wine can be so good for you!

So...how much is that bottle of wine? Could you be purchasing it at two and half times the original cost?

On the whole, it may not be that big of a deal, at least not when you compare it to a restaurant's 400% markup on a bottle. But you still may be interested to know that your \$12-13 bottle of store-bought wine actually started out a whole lot cheaper.

Start with the premise that a winery sells a load of wine to a supplier at \$5 per bottle. That supplier must then sell the wine to various local or state distributors. With designs on selling it to those distributors at a 25% markup, a new price of \$6.25 is established.

Distributors will then warehouse and sell the wine to local retailers with a 25% markup (and sometimes up to 30%), That original \$5 bottle is now at least \$7.81. (Delaware has an excise tax of \$0.97/gallon on alcohol and is one of 5 States with no sales tax).

Generally retailers will almost universally add a markup of 40%; or more, if they're the only ones selling a certain product. That reflects a new price of \$11.48. Or as you might guess, a nicely rounded-up number that conveniently ends in "9." In this case that's \$11.49 and more often than not \$11.99.

Which at the end of checkout.... drum roll please.... means that a consumer is paying between \$12.55 and \$13.10 for what started out as a \$5 bottle.

In restaurants, the standard 400% by-the-glass markup and the resulting \$12 bottle cost limit for by-the-glass wines, is often self-defeating for restaurants, as most restaurants therefore can't offer great wines for their by-the-glass selections.
