
The New Castle County Youth Planning Board is a new opportunity for high school and college-aged students this upcoming school year (approximately Sept. '20 – June '21). The program is a collaboration between NCC Department of Land Use and community partners that will connect our youth to land use planning and development in the County, empower them to participate in that process, train them in the skills needed for engaging in public affairs, and help them develop a network of connections with other civicminded people young and old.

Starting in September 2020, the Board will help update and contribute ideas to the County's 2022 Comprehensive Development Plan. Board members will meet once a month to engage with a variety of stakeholders and participate in activities that build planning knowledge and related skills, as well as foster professional development. In the first year of the program, the Board will be a platform for youth to have a say in the 10-year Comprehensive Plan and to learn more about civic engagement, local government, planning, and other aligned professions.


