this week in HISTORY

1 *England* and *Scotland* signed the peace of Greenwiche. 1543, US *postage stamps* went on sale for the first time. 1847, The first day's fighting at *Gettysburg* began. 1863, Teddy Roosevelt and his *Rough Riders* waged a victorious assault on San Juan Hill in Cuba. 1898, *Bulova Watch Co* pays \$9 for first ever network TV commercial. 1941, *ZIP codes* go into use. 1963

2 The first motion in the *Continental Congress* for independence was made on June 8th. After hard debate, the Congress voted unanimously (12-0), but secretly, for independence from the Kingdom of Great Britain on July 2, 1776, *B.J. Lane* patented the gas mask. 1850, *President Garfield* is shot. His struggle to survive lasted 80 days until his death on September 19th. 1881, Congress established the *Army Air Corps*. 1926, American aviation pioneer *Amelia Earhart* disappears. 1937, "Ah one anna two..." ABC Television premiered *The Lawrence Welk Show* 1955

3 The first cultivated *strawberry* is displayed by *Michael Kent* 1806, Confederate forces attack the center of the Union line at *Gettysburg*, but fail to break it. 1863, *John Wise* flies the first dirigible in Lancaster, PA 1878, Congress created the *Veterans Administration*. 1930, *Chic Young's* comic strip character, *Blondie* was first heard on CBS radio. 1939, *I Can't Help Myself* (Sugar Pie Honey Bunch) by the *Four Tops* topped the charts. 1965

4 The amended *Declaration of Independence*, prepared by *Thomas Jefferson*, was approved and signed by *John*

Hancock, the President of the Continental Congress. 1776, the cornerstone for the *Washington Monument* was laid. 1848, Vicksburg, MS, surrendered to Gen. *Ulysses S. Grant*. 1863, At *Mount Rushmore*, George Washington's face was dedicated. 1934, *Casey Kasem* hosted radio's *American Top 40* the first time. 1970, After being displayed or over a century, the torch on the *Statue of Liberty* is removed so it can be replaced. 1984

- 2 cups peach preserves or jam
- 3 tbsps olive oil, plus more for brushing
- 2 tbsps soy sauce
- 1 tbsp Dijon mustard
- 1 tbsp finely chopped garlic
- 1 small jalapeno, finely chopped
- Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper
- 8 frenched chicken breasts
- 4 ripe peaches, cut in half and pitted

Combine the peach preserves, olive oil, soy sauce, mustard, garlic and jalapeno in a medium bowl and season with salt and pepper. Reserve 1/2 cup.

Preheat the grill. Brush the chicken with olive oil and season with salt and pepper. Place the chicken skin-side down and cook until golden brown, 6 to 7 minutes. Turn over and continue cooking for 5 to 6 minutes. Brush both sides with the peach glaze and continue cooking until done, an additional 4 to 5 minutes.

Place the peach halves cut side down on the grill and grill for 2 minutes. Turn over, brush with the reserved 1/2 cup of peach glaze and grill until the peaches are soft, 3 to 4 more minutes. [Watch how to make this recipe.](#)

When life gives you watermelons, make martinis

To make these martinis thoroughly slushy (without watering them down), here's a technique of freezing a puree of watermelon and simple syrup in ice cube trays. Then blend the cubes with the lemon juice, vodka and melon liqueur to form drinks that are as chilling as they are pure of flavor.

on the counter

1/2 cup sugar - 1/2 cup water - 5 cups watermelon, seeds removed
2 tbsp lemon juice - 1 1/4 cups vodka - 2 oz melon liqueur, optional
8 lemon twists, for garnish

ready for some delicious?

Bring the sugar and water to a boil in a small saucepan and cook until the sugar has completely dissolved. Let cool.

In a food processor, puree the watermelon flesh. Add a little of the sugar syrup to sweeten, to taste.

Pour the pureed watermelon into two empty ice cube trays and freeze for at least four hours.

In a blender combine the frozen watermelon cubes, more simple syrup, to taste, lemon juice and vodka, melon liqueur and blend until smooth. Pour into 8 frozen martini glasses and garnish with a lemon twist

The City of Wilmington and Downtown Visions Celebrate New Downtown Garden

Calling all urban gardeners! The former site of a well-known, long-time business at 4th and Orange Streets has now been transformed into Wilmington's newest urban garden. On Friday, June 22, Mayor **Mike Purzycki** and Downtown Visions (DTV) Executive Director **Marty Hageman** welcomed friends and supporters of the new Downtown Community Garden as the site was officially dedicated. The new garden replaces the original downtown urban garden which had been around the corner on Market Street.





The former Gross Lighting Center was in business at the Orange Street site for more than a century before it was heavily damaged by fire in August of 2013 and was eventually demolished. The City obtained the property earlier this year, and with the assistance of former property owner, New Castle's **Phil Gross** and the Downtown Civic Association, it was jointly decided that the site would be used for an urban garden while the plot remains undeveloped. Ironically, it was another fire around the corner in the 400 block of Market Street that displaced the original Downtown Community Garden.


