Mike and his wife Linda have lived on The Strand for over 30 years. Mike says, "this is another opportunity to serve the State and people of Delaware."



Copeland Maritime Center located at 1124 E. Seventh St., Wilmington.

Highlighting 125 years of industrial production and the four major manufacturing plants that dominated an outsized portion of America's shipbuilding and railcar history between 1836 and 1945 Harlan and Hollingsworth, Pusey and Jones, Jackson and Sharp, and the Dravo Corporation—and the workers who built 10,000 ships and 30,000 railcars.

4 SERVINGS

- One 3 1/2–4-lb. chicken, backbone removed
 - ▶ 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
 - ► Kosher salt, freshly ground pepper
 - 2 bricks wrapped in foil



Prepare grill for high, indirect heat (for a charcoal grill, bank coals on 1 side of grill, for a gas grill, leave 1 or 2 burners off).

Place chicken on work surface, skin side up. Using your palms, press firmly on breastbone to flatten breast.

Rub chicken with oil; season with salt and pepper. Tuck wings slightly under breast. Place chicken, skin side down, over indirect heat, set bricks on top, and grill, covered, until skin is golden and crisp, 25–30 minutes. Using tongs, remove bricks; turn chicken, skin side up. Replace bricks and continue grilling until chicken is cooked through and an instant-read thermometer inserted into the thickest part of thigh registers 165°, 25–30 minutes longer.



This Salty Dog recipe is basically grapefruit juice doctored up with booze and salt—what's not to love?

Gonna need

Coarse kosher salt – Ice cubes – 1/2 cup vodka or gin 3/4 cup fresh grapefruit juice

Pour coarse salt onto small plate. Moisten rims of 2 highball glasses. Gently dip rims into salt to coat lightly. Fill glasses with ice cubes. Pour 1/4 cup vodka or gin over ice in each glass.

Divide grapefruit juice between glasses, add lime wheel and serve.




