Toll House Cookies

The recipe below is my Grammie's original from Wakefield's Toll House Inn



The chocolate chip cookie was invented by Ruth Graves Wakefield in 1938, who owned the Toll House Inn, in Whitman, Massachusetts. Wakefield wrote a best selling cookbook which was the first to include the recipe for a chocolate chip cookie, which she called the "Toll House Chocolate Crunch Cookie". As the popularity of the Toll House Chocolate Crunch Cookie increased, the sales of Nestlé's semi-sweet chocolate bars also spiked. Andrew Nestlé and Ruth Wakefield made a business arrangement: Wakefield gave Nestlé the right to use her cookie recipe and the Toll House name for one dollar and a lifetime supply of Nestlé chocolate. Nestlé began marketing chocolate chips to be used especially for cookies and printing the recipe for the Toll House Cookie on its package.

Toll House Cookies

Cream 1/2 cup Butter or other shortening with 6 tablespoons granulated sugar with 6 tablespoons brown sugar.

Add 1 egg (well beaten)

Add 1 1/8 sifted flour - 1/2 tsp salt

Add 1/2 tsp baking powder or baking soda

Add 1/2 tsp hot water

Last add 1/2 cup chopped English Walnuts and

1 pkg Nestles semi-sweet chocolate morsels

1/2 tsp vanilla

Drop by 1/2 teaspoons on a greased cookie sheet

Bake 10 - 12 minutes in 350° - 325° oven

sour watermelon Shandy



This drink seriously couldn't be easier to make. All that you need is a blender.

Fixn' Yield: 2

1 cup chopped fresh watermelon

juice of 1 fresh lemon (About 1/4 cup of juice.)

ice

1 12-ounce bottle of your favorite vegan sour beer ([Barnivore lists lots of vegan sours](#), so it should be really easy to find one!)

Do in'

1. In your blender, puree the watermelon and lemon juice until you have a nice, smooth puree.

2. Divide the watermelon puree between 2 pint glasses full of ice, and top with the beer. There is a little bit of finesse required here, because pouring beer over ice can make a lot of foam. Tilt your glass, and very slowly pour the beer down the tilted side, stopping to stir gently if it starts to foam up. This is more a trickle of beer than a pour. Take your time pouring, and you'll end up saving time that you would have spent waiting for half a pint of foam to settle down. Continue tilting and slowly pouring until you have a full glass. Stir to combine, garnish with a lemon round, and serve!
