The New Castle rode on Sunday morning last June 29th between **Waterman's Crab House** in Rock Hall to **Eastern Neck National Wildlife Refuge**...just under 20 miles round trip. A healthy good turn out of 13 members of our informal club. Eric Sallee said "it was our largest turnout on a ride this year". The destination at the Refuge end of the trip was the Visitors Center, originally known as the Eastern Neck Lodge, built in 1933. It has obviously expanded over the years and now houses nature display areas, class and meeting rooms, gift shop and restroom facilities. Just outside are some paths through typical vegetation and a wetlands "blind" for viewing wildlife.



The area of the present Refuge was one of the first settled areas of Maryland and held by the Wickes family from 1650 to 1902 (see Wiki entry under Eastern Neck National Wildlife Refuge). The ride was pretty level, had some nice stretches of shade and was not heavily trafficked. And as we learned long ago in our riding ventures, it's better to start the ride close to where you want to end up eating, hence, lunch at Waterman's. – E. Sallee

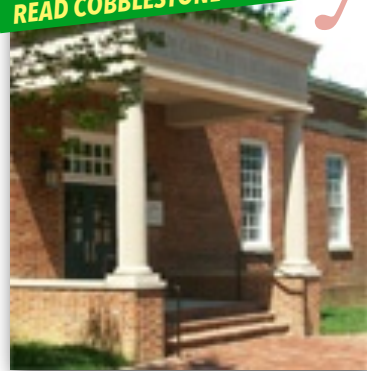

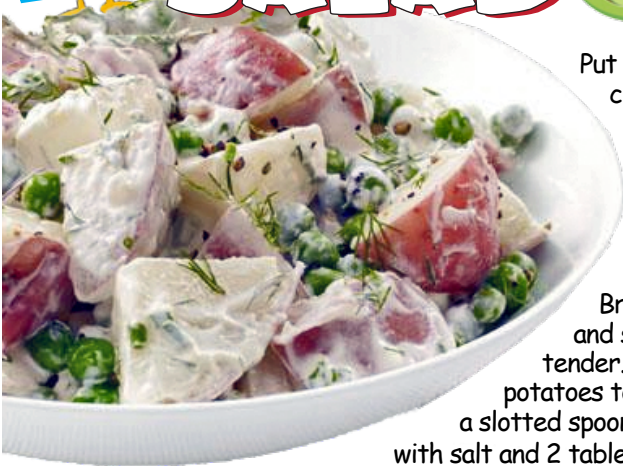

POTATO SALAD with

COBBLE COOKS



Put 2 pounds chopped red-skinned potatoes in a pot, cover with water by 2 inches and add salt. Bring to a boil and simmer until tender. Transfer the potatoes to a bowl using a slotted spoon; sprinkle

with salt and 2 tablespoons cider vinegar. Boil 10 ounces frozen peas in the same pot until just tender. Drain, rinse and add to the potatoes. Whisk 3/4 cup each mayonnaise and sour cream, and 1/2 cup each chopped chives and dill. Toss with the potatoes and peas; season with salt and pepper.

Greatest SUMMER Mistake

Twas on the 8th of July in 1881 that the first ice cream sundae was served -- by accident. Druggist Edward Berner of Two Rivers, Wisconsin, couldn't serve the desirable, but scandalous (*not allowed on the Sabbath*) flavored soda water that a customer wanted. Mr. Berner compromised and put ice cream in a dish and poured the syrup on top (*chocolate syrup was only used for making flavored and ice-cream sodas, at the time*). Voila! An ice cream Sunday! (*The spelling was later changed to 'sundae'*).

a history of New Castle's Piers & Wharfs

On February 1, 1802 the Delaware Legislature replaced the former Managers of the Pier lottery by the appointment of three Commissioners, Archibald Alexander, James Riddle and James McCallmont. Of these Alexander and Riddle had been Managers of the Pier Lottery but McCallmont was a new appointment. These commissioners were to receive the amount of money on hand from the managers and build one or more piers or repair the "sunken pier off Delaware Street."

It is difficult to determine whether the final action in building the last two piers was conducted by the former Managers of the lottery or by the new Commissioners, because on February 10, 1802, just eight days after the Commissioners were appointed, it would seem that the repairs to the piers was then being carried on for on that date George Read in advertising for sale of his then residence, now owned by Mr. Elmer Bailly, says:

"the repair of the piers in the harbor of New Castle, one of which la adjacent to this property has been commenced and will no doubt be completed during the course of the ensuing summer. And the merchants of Philadelphia by their memorial to Congress have recommended the erection of five additional piers in the harbor".

Whether the pier opposite Alexander's Alley was built by the Managers or by the Commissioners, it seems to have been placed exactly in accordance with the resolution of the Managers of December 31, 1801. If it was built in accordance with that

resolution, it would show both the size and location of the original pier off Harmony Street, for the pier at Alexander's Alley was to be of the same size and range with the pier off Harmony Street.

The pier now remaining at the foot of Alexander's Alley does not measure 50' x 30' and since it was to be the same size as the one off Harmony Street it would seem probable that the first pier erected in 1795 as advertised in the Philadelphia paper and measuring 50' x 30' was the pier erected or "sunk" off Delaware Street.

On April 6, 1802 Congress appropriated \$30,000. for the erection of piers in the Delaware River provided that the sites therefore were ceded to the United States.

On January 1, 1803 the Delaware Legislature after reciting the Act of Congress and that it was proposed that a part of the Government appropriation used for piers at New Castle, vested in the United States, not only the piers already erected but also the sites of the proposed new piers.

Latrobes map in 1804 and other records at the time refer or call the piers then in the harbor as the "U.S. Piers." This, I think, does not mean that they were erected by the United States but has reference to the fact that the piers were ceded to the United States in 1803.

After 1803 the control, repair or replacement of the piers in the New Castle harbor has been exclusively in the Federal Government. It must be clearly kept in mind that the piers heretofore mentioned are not to be confused with the piers now remaining in the harbor and some others which were placed there and since removed.

The erection and repair of piers by the United States was accomplished upon several separate occasions notably in 1826, 1836 and at later times. These constitute an entirely different subject matter from the original piers herein discussed and must be the subject of an entirely different investigation.

This is a fertile field for someone else to plow and one not too difficult, for it is believed that, unlike the present, almost at all the material may be found in one place, viz., the appropriate governmental offices in Washington.
