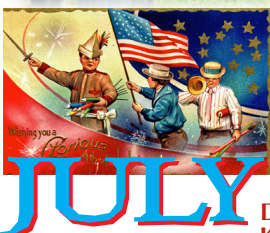
Mayor Donald Reese introduced Russ Smith, First State National Monument, Superintendent after his remarks.



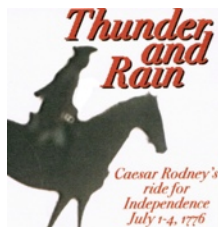

Preheat oven 350°. Grease 13x9 inch pan. Layer the beef on the bottom of the pan, set aside. (brown the meat first and drain all the grease from it before adding to the mixture)

In a med mixing bowl add sour cream and mushroom soup and mix well. Then layer the mixture on top of the beef, then add cheese. Top with tater tots. Bake covered for 45 minutes. Uncover and bake 15 minutes longer, adding extra cheese here if desired.

1 bottle Pimm's No. 1 Cup
Liqueur

Fruit

- 2 bottles of white wine
- 2 12 oz cans Sprite (with sugar, NO high fructose corn syrup)

Place all the cut up fruit in a large bowl or punch bowl, then pour the bottle of Pimm's

over the fruit, cover and set aside for 2-3 hours.

Now add the white wine and Sprite and serve in tall glasses.
