

## what goes in it...

- ★2 lbs. extra lean ground beef
- ★1 can cream of mushroom soup
- ★1 16oz Sour Cream
- ★1 cup grated cheddar cheese (or more!)

## put'n together

Preheat oven 350°. Grease 13x9 inch pan. Layer the beef on the bottom of the pan, set aside. (brown the meat first and drain all the grease from it before adding to the mixture)

Place all the cut up fruit in a large bowl or punch bowl, then pour the bottle of Pimm's

over the fruit, cover and set aside for 2-3 hours.

Now add the white wine and Sprite and serve in tall glasses.




