Independence was read in forum here in the presence of the [Delaware] House of Assembly and 400 to 500 people, the principal inhabitants of this County, who gave three Huzzas, and immediately took the King's arms and burnt them with the Constable's Staves, etc."So wrote Thomas Rodney, brother of Caesar.

City Council member Mike Quaranta representing the City, talked about John Trumbull's painting The Declaration of Independence. "The scene proclaims that in Philadelphia in the year 1776, a momentous, high minded, statement of far reaching consequence was committed to paper. it was not the decree of a king, a sultan, emperor, or czar, or something enacted by some far distant parliament.

It was a declaration of political faith and brave intent, freely arrived at by an american congress. Jefferson, Adams, and Franklin stand front and center, as they did in the real drama. Absent is George Washington, who had left a year earlier to take command of the army". He thanked everyone for being here and joining us in our wonderful city - so rich in history with its own place in that protean time, secure and forever meaningful.



Egg salad and potato salad: Unite! If you like the 7 minute still-soft yolks that dress the salad fine, but you can cook the eggs a minute or two longer if you like them more set.

 $\overline{\it 2}\%$ lbs new or baby Yukon Gold potatoes, scrubbed,4 large eggs, room temperature, 1 tsp mustard seeds, 3 tbsp apple cider vinegar, 2 tbsp whole grain mustard, 1 tsp honey, 1/3 cup olive oil, Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper, 1 cup parsley leaves with tender stems, 3 tbsp coarsely chopped dill pickles, 2 tbsp chopped fresh chives

here's the don'

• Steam potatoes, until tender, 20-30 minutes, depending on size. Transfer to a plate and let cool. • Now, cook eggs in a large saucepan of boiling water 7 -10 minutes. Drain; transfer eggs to a bowl of ice water and chill until cold. Drain and peel; set eggs aside. Toast mustard seeds in a dry small skillet over medium-low heat, tossing constantly, until seeds start to pop, about 1 minute. Transfer to a small bowl (be ready with bowl; once seeds get going, it's chaos). • Whisk vinegar, mustard, and honey in a large bowl. Whisking constantly, gradually add oil; whisk until emulsified. Season with salt and pepper. Set 3 Tbsp. vinaigrette aside for drizzling. • Halve potatoes and add to bowl with vinaigrette. Add parsley and toss to coat; season with salt and pepper. Transfer to a platter. Halve reserved eggs and tuck in between potatoes. Drizzle with reserved vinaigrette. Top with pickles, chives, and toasted mustard seeds.







In 1853, it was sold by Elizabeth Berry Morris (the granddaughter of James Morris) to cousin George Wilson Cummins. After extensive renovations, the mansion was renamed Woodlawn. It was a two-story, five-bay temple-fronted frame dwelling in the Greek Revival-style. Remembered by many as "the" place for that classy dinner or a Sunday destination. Another Delaware National Historic Registry treasure gone.


