

# **Upcoming Delaware Street**Lane Closures / Restrictions

On Tuesday, July 9, the City's contractor Cirillo Brothers will begin replacing the storm sewer, believed to be about a century old, in Delaware Street between 2<sup>nd</sup> Street and The Strand. This work will necessitate excavating and removing the existing pipe, plugging abandoned laterals, and placing a new pipe. The contractor will need to close

both lanes of Delaware Street to vehicular traffic between 2<sup>nd</sup> Street and The Strand, beginning at 7:00 a.m. each day, to perform the work. The contractor may also close the sidewalk on the north side of this section of road to not endanger the public but the southside sidewalk will remain open. All closures will be reopened by 5:00 p.m. each day, no closures will occur on weekends. The work is estimated to take between three and six weeks. Multiple unknowns do not allow for a more precise schedule.

During the lane closures, multiple warning signs will be placed and flaggers will be positioned at the intersections of Harmony Street and The Strand, in the middle of the Strand, and The Strand and Delaware Street. Local traffic will be allowed to pass at Harmony Street but through traffic will not. Residents of The Strand are asked to minimize their car usage as much as possible during this time period. In instances when usage is unavoidable, residents leaving their homes should proceed to Delaware Street as always where the flagger will direct them to turn around at the Wharf and then proceed up The Strand. The flagger at Harmony Street will block entering traffic until the exiting vehicle passes. The City understands that this may be inconvenient to some but with one-way traffic on area streets, this was determined to be the best approach.

#### Residents are asked to obey the flaggers' instructions.

Residents on Dalby Alley will not be able to access Dalby Alley, and of course there will be no parking on Delaware Street between the Strand and Second, during these times. Parked cars will be towed.

A second phase of work, not yet scheduled, will involve lining of the storm sewer between The Strand and the outfall at the River. This work will not involve excavations and will last just a few days but will necessitate temporary lane restrictions. Also, the larger project of restoring the pavement and curbs on Delaware Street from 3<sup>rd</sup> Street to the Wharf will be let for bidding in coming weeks with the intent of beginning work later in the fall. This work will last for many months and will necessitate both temporary lane restrictions as well as full closures at varying times. The City will provide more information for both as dates get closer.

**GONNA NEED** 

1/4 c. grated Parmesan - 1/4 c. Italian style panko crispy bread crumbs - 1 tbsp butter, melted - 4 boneless skinless chicken breasts 1/2 tsp garlic powder - 1/2 tsp salt - 1/4 tsp pepper 2 tbsp refrigerated creamy Caesar dressing, plus more for serving - Chopped Italian (flat leaf) parsley, if desired

#### **EZ**FIXN'

Make oven happy at 425°F. Spray 15x10x1-inch pan with cooking spray. In small bowl, mix Parmesan cheese, bread crumbs and melted butter, mixing well.

Between pieces of plastic wrap or waxed paper, place each chicken breast smooth side down; gently pound with flat side of meat mallet or rolling pin until about 1/2-inch thick. Season both sides of chicken with garlic powder, salt and pepper.

Place chicken on pan; brush tops of chicken with Caesar dressing\*. Sprinkle with bread crumb mixture, pressing slightly to stick. Bake 10 to 14 minutes or until juice of chicken is clear when center of thickest part is cut (at least  $165^{\circ}$ F). Garnish with chopped parsley.

\*Other creamy shelf-stable brands will also work in this recipe

## THE VESPER

also known as the Vesper Martini, was made famous by James Bond, The cocktail best known for being ordered "shaken not stirred" was invented by none other than Bond author Ian Fleming. The Vesper first appeared in his book "Casino Royale," which was published in 1953 and gets its name from fictional double agent Vesper Lynd.

1/2 oz Lillet blanc apéritif Add all the ingredients into a mixing glass with ice and stir (or, if preparing the Bond way, shake). Strain into a chilled cocktail glass. Twist a slice of lemon peel over the drink, rub along the rim of the glass, and

drop it in.




## Morsbags Sew-a-Thon





# The Negro Baseball League



## **Presentation by Ron Whittington**

Through a first-person interpretation of Baseball Hall of Famer William "Judy" Johnson, learn the history of the Negro Baseball Leagues prior to Jackie Robinson's participation in the major leagues of American baseball.
