Last Tuesday night City Council was faced with deciding on whether the traffic light at the intersection of Delaware and 6th Street should stay or option #2, a trial period should be accepted where the state would "temporarily" put in the 4-way stop sign to see if it would be an effective option to replace the traffic light. #3, a 4-way stop sign should replace the traffic light. In the end, after some heated discussion and some waffling by a couple of Council members, the vote was unanimous to keep the

light. The great thing is, since the current traffic light needs to be replaced with a more updated one with pedestrian crossing lights, the state is now willing to pick up the tab for it. This is a total turnaround by the state from just six months ago when they basically said, the traffic light needs to be replaced and the City of New Castle has to foot the bill.

Councilmember Leary first said that people should consider the esthetics of a new light and all that comes with it. Councilmember Platt said, that council should consider trying option #2 which would be a trial period for a 4-way stop sign pattern. The reason, he felt that a traffic light is just a 50% chance that it's better than the 4-way stop sign pattern, so we should try it as the stop sign configuration can be changed back to a traffic light with a new traffic light. Councilmember Di Mondi stated, if we vote on option #2, for a trial period for the 4-way stop sign pattern, in a year after the trial period, who's to say DelDOT won't back out of their willingness to cover the cost of the traffic light replacement.

The **Carolina Reaper** is the hottest chili pepper in the world, according to Guinness World Records: In terms of sheer spiciness, it measures in at an average 1.6 million on the ► Scoville heat scale (a jalapeno, by comparison, is typically under

comparison, is typically under 10,000). Just looking at it, you know it's one mean pepper. The pepper is red and gnarled, with a small pointed tail. Last April a 34 year old man was admitted to the hospital when he was struck with severe headaches days after eating a single Carolina Reaper. Scans of his head revealed several arteries in his brain had constricted,

which led to a diagnosis of reversible cerebral vasoconstriction syndrome.

IMPORTANT: Let the names of these peppers – like **Scorpion** and **Reaper** – be a warning. These peppers are wicked hot, and, as such, they must be handled carefully. If you're going to dance with the devil, wear kitchen gloves, eye goggles, and take great care throughout the cooking process. Know, too, **how to combat chili burn** to keep yourself safe.

This **Wednesday, July 18th, at 7 pm**, the New Castle Court House Museum, will present "An Immigrant Story: Crossing the Atlantic in a 17th Century Sailing Ship," a program by New Castle's own Jean Norvell.

Welcome aboard! It's a two month voyage, and our ship is not big. Some of you will live and sleep in the cabin below deck, but others will have to sleep in the Skiff on deck, which also houses the animals. Where you sleep will be determined by the name tag you draw. It determines your social rank. We have no refrigeration, so we need to ensure that the food on board has been properly treated before we set sail, and will use the test method that has been in place since the Sixteenth Century. We will also need ample supplies of beer and wine to modify the



water. Without them water becomes scummy and unfit to drink. The crew will not discuss shipboard hygiene with you, but we have to have a talk about
