





1 lb. Gemelli - 4 slices bacon - ranch dressing - 3 hard boiled eggs, roughly chopped - 1 c. cherry tomatoes, halved - 1 avocado, chopped - 1/4 c. blue cheese, crumbled - kosher salt - Freshly ground black pepper

here's how

- In a large pot of salted boiling water, cook gemelli according to package directions until al dente. Drain and transfer to a large serving bowl.
- Solution Crospy. Drain and chop, then set aside.
