



Combine all ingredients in blender until smooth, scraping down sides of blender with rubber spatula as necessary.

## Makes about 3/4 cup sauce.

The list of ingredients that could find their way into **your** secret sauce are endless. Want to make a condiment that's on the sweeter side? Add more ketchup and toss some relish in there. Need more spice? Bust out the cayenne pepper.

Try the recipe as is, at least once. Just don't blame me if you start putting it on everything you eat.



 Slice each lime in half lengthwise. Use a spoon to hollow out and discard the flesh, so all you have left is the rind. Place lime halves, cutside up, on a platter; set aside.

 Pour limeade into a small saucepan and sprinkle with the gelatin. Stir constantly over low heat until gelatin is dissolved, about 5 minutes.

 Remove from heat. Stir in tequila and Cointreau. Pour mixture into lime rinds. Place in refrigerator to set for at least 3 hours or overnight.

 Once set, slice each lime cup in half to make 16 wedges. Pour sea salt into a small bowl and dip one lip of each wedge in the salt.
 Serve yourself immediately.

# he still can't believe it

Since 1893, when the Sunday Breakfast Mission was founded in Wilmington, the faith-based charity has operated on a shoestring. So imagine Laymon's surprise when, out of the blue, a New Jersey couple gave the mission 1800s mansion worth nearly \$700,000 in the heart of historic New Castle.

The House is called the Kensey Johns, Jr. House and was donated to the Sunday Breakfast Mission.

Built decades before the mission began, the house is a landmark at Fourth and Delaware streets, located across the street from the famed Amstel House, built in the 1730s, owned by the New Castle Historical Society and considered the first grand mansion of Delaware. Being refurbished and decorated into a Designer Show House and when they're are finished, the house will go up for sale. Starting Fri.,

September 25th, the house is open to the public for tours Thurs. through Sun. 11am - 4pm until Sun. November 8<sup>th</sup>.

NC Police Chief Daniel Tjaden reported on the Home Invasion in Boothhurst. A vehicle has been recovered and arrests should be forthcoming.

After department reports and communications, City Council


honored the Reverend Albert Clinton Gaither, Jr. on the occasion of his retirement. Reverend Gaither recently has served as pastor at the Buttonwood Methodist Church for the past eleven years. One of his many years in the ministry.

Other matters that were on the table include:

- The Fishing Pier south of Dobbinsville on Rt. 9 unanimously passed. The pier will be constructed and maintained by Delaware Division of Fish and Wildlife.
- The Verizon Tower at Municipal Boulevard 5 year contract was approved. This lease agreement adds \$20,000 plus annually to the City.
- Truck traffic thru Dobbinsville is always a popular topic for discussion. NC Police Chief Daniel Tjaden has met with neighboring police departments, the State Police and the Attorney General's office. The AG's office will research and propose legislation that better defines the "two axel – local delivery" issue. In the meantime the State Police truck unit will patrol and set up radar. On June 30th one resident of the troubled area counted 57 trucks between 9am and 5pm. Once she waited 5 minutes to cross the street to accompany her daughter to the school bus stop. Many residents tell of calls to DelDOT have proven futile.
- Council Member Ted Megginson withdrew his proposed Ordinance 503 on the meadows, weeds and grasses. He and the Trustees will be meeting to define their respective issues. He noted that the Trustees have already reduced or eliminated plantings in Dobbinsville. (more on page 8)

Gail Seitz was approved as Mayor's appointment to the Planning Commission. Council's Recommendation of Marco **Boyce** to the Tree Advisory Commission was approved.






When I first moved to New Castle in 1975 the first question wasn't about family or profession, it was, "how many cars do you have and where will you be parking?"

Not much has changed as the issue was brought to public attention once again at City Council's meeting last Tuesday.
Before the **Don't Pave Paradise Action** 

Group, all lined up to address the head table. Council Member Albert Vannucci recalled that the same arguments were bantered about when he served on the Parking Committee twenty years ago. He said that yes, \$140,000 has been allocated, but no site had been chosen for a parking lot and wondered how everyone thought it was going to be by the tennis courts, which is one of five sites recommended by the Parking Committee. That Committee recommended five possible locations: 1) Broad Dyke at Chestnut St. (old recycle site); 2) Municipal Lot B (east side of tennis courts); 3) Municipal Lot A (off 3rd Street-behind bank); 4) Fort Casimir; 5) Battery Park Lot Expansion.

Here are some comments from residents from West 3rd, 4th, and South Streets, the Don't Pave group: "Our aim is to prevent the paving of green space at any of the proposed sites along West 3rd Street. We support parking in the other two sites already under consideration". "Pave, stripe and sign the gravel parking lots at the southern terminus of 3rd Street and the foot of Chestnut Street". "West 3rd Street is very narrow, and must accommodate both on-street parking and the passage of vehicles. With the current level of traffic, residents report frequent damage to their parked cars – one couple has had two vehicles sideswiped a total of six times". "We ask that the three proposed sites on West 3rd Street be removed from consideration. There remain two sites already recommended for parking, at Fort Casimir and on Chestnut Street at the former recycling location. Both are remote from residences near the trouble-prone Battery Park area". One suggestion of a 'drop-off' location in the center of town and directing parking to the former recycle location.

Finally Council Member DiMondi suggested "take that \$140,000 and put in parking meters and the we'd have no parking problem." He said paid parking would be for non residents only, residents would all receive parking stickers. What other tourists destinations don't have metered parking?

Ltd. and the Mendelsons".


He sent this FROM THE PARK he painted in 1990 to share with you.




