The Hot Dog's True History *The origin of the word "hot dog" stirs as much debate as the existence of UFOs. Conflicting stories abound and everyone wants to claim ownership of the catchy moniker of America's favorite food.*

Why are there so many stories about how the hot dog got its name and who invented the hot dog bun? Could there be a conspiracy involved? The truth is out there and with the help of avid hot dog historians and linguists, the Council set out to find that truth. The infamous story about cartoonist Tad Dorgan of New York Journal?

"Forget about it," says Bruce Kraig, Ph.D., hot dog historian. *As the legend goes*, Dorgan observed vendor Harry Stevens selling the "hot dachshund sausages" during a game at the New York Polo Grounds and shouting "Get your red-hot dachshund sausages!" Dorgan illustrated this scene with a dachshund dog nestled in a bun with the caption "get your hot dogs." No one has found a copy of the cartoon said to have given the hot dog its name. Maybe the cartoon never existed. Or maybe it is buried deep within the National Archives or the maze of the Pentagon.

Kraig suggests the cartoon began as a joke between Dorgan and the vendor who were reputedly good friends, but was by no means the first reference to "hot dogs." In fact, one report the Council came across suggested the story may have come from Stevens' obituary in the New York Herald on May 4, 1934, in which the events are recorded.

Barry Popick, a prominent hot dog historian says the word "hot dog" began appearing in college magazines

in the 1890s. Students at Yale University began to refer to the wagons selling hot sausages in buns outside their dorms as "dog wagons." He said one of the popular stands was dubbed even "The Kennel Club." It didn't take long for the use of the word "dog" to become "hot dog." Popick found the first reference to "hot dogs" in an article published in the October 19, 1895, issue of the Yale Record, which referred to folks "contentedly munching on hot dogs."

But the truth is that Germans have been eating their "little dog" sausages with bread for ages. Some reports say German immigrants first sold them from push carts in New York City's Bowery in the 1860s. Another story claims Charles Feltman, a German butcher in 1871, served the sausages with milk rolls from his stand on Coney Island.

While the hot dog's precise history may never be known, perhaps it is this mystery that adds to the hot dog's mystique and has helped the hot dog maintain its position as one of America's favorite foods!

Why are there typically 10 hot dogs per pack and eight buns per bag?

Ah, one of the great mysteries of the universe. You would think the makers of these two inherently linked items would collaborate on this.

CITY OF NEW CASTLE

PIER UPDATE

For more than two years, the City of New Castle has been studying the feasibility of building a new pier to replace the one destroyed by Hurricane Sandy in 2012.

Throughout this process, we have kept local elected officials and state agencies apprised of these efforts. At this time, we wish to thank State representative Mike Mulrooney and the Bond Committee for including in the FY 2015 Bond Bill \$800,000 for the replacement pier.

As part of ongoing efforts to keep citizens informed and engaged in the decision making process, **City Council will be holding a public workshop in August, to review a study that highlights the economic benefits the pier will have on both the City and the State economy. The City will announce when this meeting will take place, once the date is confirmed.**

City Council will make the final decision on the pier once all studies have been completed and DNREC and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers have issued required permits.

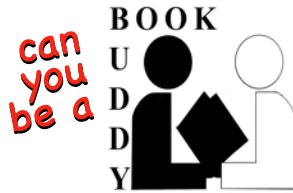

Tomatoes Provençale

gather up... for 8 tomato halves

- 4 large, firm ripe tomatoes
- Salt and freshly ground pepper
- ½ cup lightly pressed down crumbs from firm white bread
- 2 tbsp minced shallots or scallions
- 1 large clove garlic, pureed
- ¼ cup minced fresh parsley
- 3 to 4 tbsp olive oil



make like Julia

Cut the tomatoes in half (not through the stem). Gently squeeze them to remove excess juice; dig out the seeds with your *little* finger. Salt and pepper the insides lightly and turn upside down on a rack to drain while you prepare the stuffing.

Toss the bread crumbs with the shallots or scallions, garlic, parsley, salt and pepper to taste, blending in droplets of olive oil as you do so.

Divide the stuffing into eight portions and mound into each tomato; arrange the tomatoes in a baking dish. Drizzle a little more oil over the crumbs, *if you wish*.

(May be prepared in advance up to this point.)

Preheat the oven to 400°

About 20 minutes before serving, bake in the upper third level until the crumbs are lightly browned and the tomatoes are hot through

but still hold their shape. Serve them soon, since they risk a collapse if kept warm. *(just like us this month)*

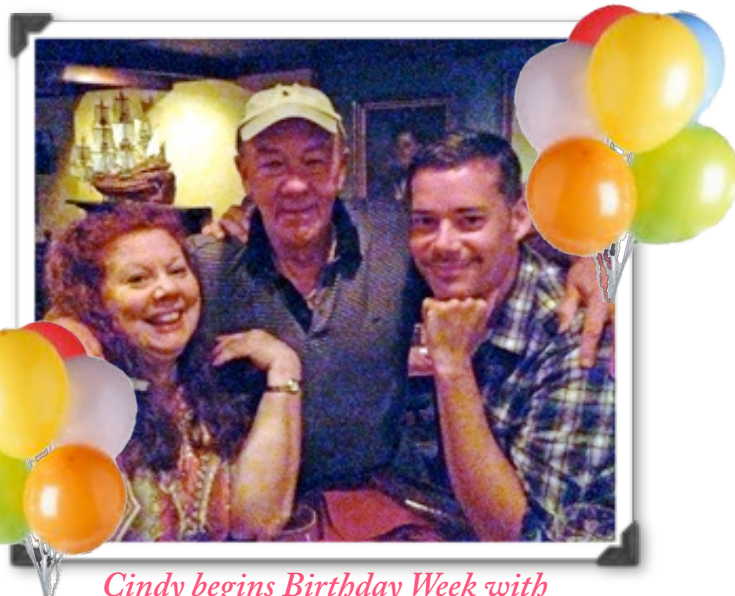

DOG vs BUN

These days, manufacturers are starting to offer different quantities of hot dogs per pack and bakers are breaking out of the eight-to-the-pack mold and offering 10 and even 12 packs of buns. However, this is the exception to the rule.

When hot dog buns were introduced, hot dogs were sold in varying quantities at the butcher shop. Not until 1940 were hot dogs packaged the way we currently see them in the grocery store. When manufacturers began packaging hot dogs, they chose the 10 to the pack formula. Today hot dogs are sold most often in eight or ten to the pound packs, but some are sold other quantities as well.

Sandwich rolls, or hot dog buns, most often come eight to the pack because the buns are baked in clusters of four in pans designed to hold eight rolls. While baking pans now come in configurations that allow baking 10 and even 12 at a time, the eight roll pan remains the most popular.

However, to save you from the bread aisle arithmetic anxiety, you need to purchase five bags of eight-to-the-pack buns and four 10-to-the-pack hot dogs to break even.

And a specially note - while they are commonly called "hot dog buns," they are often used to hold sausages, which come in their own unique quantities.

2014 E-ZPass

Major media reports of email scam.

This one hides behind The E-ZPass transponder used to quickly pay tolls. *E-ZPass is the last thing I would have!*

Transportation agencies that administer E-ZPass accounts are warning their customers to beware of an e-mail scam that begins with a claim they haven't paid their bills. Above is the one I received.

People targeted by the scammers are not necessarily E-ZPass users. The sending address that the e-mail reader sees at first glance may not be the full address, but rather something like, "E-ZPass Info," or "E-ZPass Customer Service Center."
