Message From City Council President Linda Ratchford

We appreciate your continued cooperation and understanding as the City and MSC work to improve the storm sewer and water pipe infrastructure on Delaware Street. While we are trying to minimize the impacts, we realize there is some inconvenience to visitors, residents and businesses and we thank you for your continued patience.



Last Tuesday the City Council and the public received an update on the planned repair work on the railroad crossing at Delaware Street. This has been a topic at multiple meetings including a public workshop. DelDOT and Century Engineering have worked with the City and the public to make some pedestrian and signal improvements in the general

area; however, the project scope is limited to the railroad crossing and does not address the needed overall improvements.

The City has requested a study from WILMAPCO to address traffic, bicycle and pedestrian concerns on major corridors within our city boundaries including the Ferry Cut-Off Delaware Street intersection. We anticipate this process could take several years. Meanwhile, the railroad crossing is a high priority safety issue that needs to be addressed.



To accommodate the new crossing design and equipment, Council voted to permanently close 8th Street at Delaware Street/Route 9/Route 273 to vehicular traffic from the street intersection to the Saint Gabriel's Lodge parking lot entrance on 8th street. The design provides pedestrian and St. Gabe's parking lot access. We will work closely with DelDOT to manage traffic impacts from the Delaware and 8th Street intersection closure during construction. We will monitor traffic impacts, if any, from the permanent closure on neighboring streets and proactively address any concerns with DelDOT. We expect the construction work will take approximately three weeks in the summer of 2020 and we will notify residents of the start of the project a few months in advance.

Citron moves on but not far

Upcoming Delaware Street Lane Closures / Restrictions



On Tuesday, July 9, the City's contractor Cirillo Brothers will begin replacing the storm sewer, believed to be about a century old, in Delaware Street between 2nd Street and The Strand. This work will necessitate excavating and removing the existing pipe, plugging abandoned laterals, and placing a new pipe. The contractor will need to close both lanes of Delaware Street to vehicular traffic between 2nd Street and The Strand, beginning at 7:00 a.m. each day, to perform the work. The contractor may also close the sidewalk on the north side of this section of road to not endanger the public but the southside sidewalk will remain open. All closures will be reopened by 5:00 p.m. each day, no closures will occur on weekends. The work is estimated to take between three and six weeks. Multiple unknowns do not allow for a more precise schedule.

During the lane closures, multiple warning signs will be placed and flaggers will be positioned at the intersections of Harmony Street and The Strand, in the middle of the Strand, and The Strand and Delaware Street. Local traffic will be allowed to pass at Harmony Street but through traffic will not. Residents of The Strand are asked to minimize their car usage as much as possible during this time period. In instances when usage is unavoidable, residents leaving their homes should proceed to Delaware Street as always where the flagger will direct them to turn around at the Wharf and then proceed up The Strand. The flagger at Harmony Street will block entering traffic until the exiting vehicle passes. The City understands that this may be inconvenient to some but with one-way traffic on area streets, this was determined to be the best approach.

Residents are asked to obey the flaggers' instructions.

Residents on Dalby Alley will not be able to access Dalby Alley, and of course there will be no parking on Delaware Street between the Strand and Second, during these times. Parked cars will be towed.

A second phase of work, not yet scheduled, will involve lining of the storm sewer between The Strand and the outfall at the River. This work will not involve excavations and will last just a few days but will necessitate temporary lane restrictions. Also, the larger project of restoring the pavement and curbs on Delaware Street from 3rd Street to the Wharf will be let for bidding in coming weeks with the intent of beginning work later in the fall. This work will last for many months and will necessitate both temporary lane restrictions as well as full closures at varying times. The City will provide more information for both as dates get closer.

means many leaves or layers and this crisp pastry's texture resembles leaves stacked on each other. Sfogliatelle look like seashells when baked. The characteristic ridges form as the layers of dough separate during baking. The pastries are filled with a sweetened ricotta cream, semolina, and cinnamon mixture. Lemon zest or candied orange bits are also sometimes added.

Ya gonna need....

for pastry

- 2 cups all-purpose flour - 1 cup semolina flour - 2 tbsp sugar
- 1/8 tsp salt - 3/4 cup unsalted butter, cut into cubes
- 1/2 cup water - 1/2 cup lard or margarine, melted

Listen up cupcake... substitute 1 (1-lb package) of frozen puff pastry dough, thawed, for this recipe! **Avoid the mess!**

- Filling** 1 cup milk - 1/4 cup semolina flour - 1 cup ricotta cheese
 1 egg, beaten - 1/4 cup sugar 1 tbs candied orange bits or grated orange zest - 1/4 tsp cinnamon. Confectioners' sugar for dusting

Let's make some Remove the dough from the refrigerator and divide it into 2 equal pieces. If you are using puff pastry, use 1 of the 2 pieces from the package.

On a lightly floured surface, roll one piece into a 16 x 22-inch rectangle. The dough will be very, very thin. Starting at a short end, brush the first 1/3 of dough with some of the melted lard. Begin rolling the pastry up like a jellyroll.

Brush the second 1/3 of dough with more lard, and continue rolling. Finally, brush the last 1/3 with lard, and roll up completely.

Cut the roll into 1-inch pieces, which will resemble narrow rolls of ribbon.

Forming the sfogliatelle: Place one of the slices in the palm of your hand. Press the thumb of your other hand in the center of the pastry and push it down to form a small ribbed cup.

You do not want the ribs to separate. Now you will begin to stretch the dough.

Carefully work around the cup, pushing down with your thumbs and pulling up with your fingers. Think of it as an opening a collapsible travel cup. Form each piece into a cone, shaped 3 to 4 inches across the mouth and 1-inch at the tip. oven happy at 425°

Lightly grease or line 2-3 baking sheets with parchment paper.

Fill each pastry cone with 2 tablespoons of the filling. Gently press the open edges together to seal the pastry. Pull out the top ends to form a seashell shape. Place the sfogliatelle 1-inch apart on the baking sheets.

Repeat the procedure with the second piece of pastry dough.

Bake 15 minutes or until golden brown and crisp.

Allow the pastry to cool on the baking sheets for 5 minutes.

Transfer the pastry to wire racks to cool completely.

To serve:

Sprinkle the sfogliatelle with confectioners' sugar and serve.

1 oz Old Forester 86 proof Kentucky Straight Bourbon Whiskey

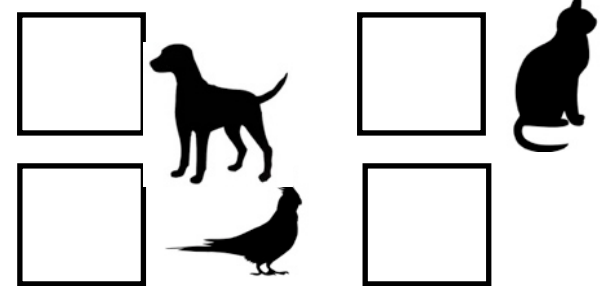
1 oz Midori Melon Liqueur
