National Park Service to Hold

Community Update Briefing in New Castle

The National Park Service announced today that there will be a Community Update Briefing on **Wednesday, August 14th, at 7 PM in the Court Room of the Old Court House Museum.** The topic of the briefing will be the status of First State National Monument. Superintendent Russ Smith will be on hand to brief local residents about the park, discuss the park's future outlook, and to answer questions.

Superintendent Smith said today, "First State National Monument belongs to all Americans, but New Castle residents have a special stake in it because an important part of it is located in their community. I'd like to make sure local residents understand what to expect of the park."

President Obama created First State National Monument on March 25, 2013 as the first national park in Delaware and the 400th unit of the National Park System. Included within the park are: the 1,100 acre Woodlawn Tract along Brandywine Creek; the New Castle Green (including the Arsenal, the Sheriff's House, and the Old Court House); and the Dover Green. Woodlawn and the Sheriff's House are owned by the Park Service. The other sites in New Castle will continue to be owned and operated by the Division of Historical & Cultural Affairs of the State of Delaware.

Salsa

- ♦ 2 large oranges
- ♦ 1/4 c. extra-virgin olive oil
- ♦ 1/4 c. fresh lemon juice
- ♦ 1/2 c. chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley
- ♦ 2 scallions, finely sliced
- ♦ 3 tbsps chopped fresh mint leaves
- ♦ 2 tbsps capers, rinsed, drained and coarsely chopped
- ♦ 2 tbsps orange zest
- ♦ 1 tsp lemon zest
- ♦ 1 tsp crushed red pepper flakes
- ♦ Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper

Salmon

- ♦ Vegetable or canola oil, for oiling the grill
- ♦ 4 (4 to 5-oz) center cut salmon fillets, skinned, each about 3-inches square
- ♦ 2 tbsps amber agave nectar
- ♦ Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper

For the salsa: Peel and trim the ends from each orange. Using a paring knife, cut along the membrane on both sides of each segment. Free the segments and add them to a medium bowl. Add the olive oil, lemon juice, parsley, scallions, mint, capers, orange zest, lemon zest, and red pepper flakes. Toss lightly and season with salt and pepper, to taste. Set aside.

For the salmon: Put a grill pan over medium-high heat or preheat a gas or charcoal grill. Brush the grilling rack with vegetable oil to keep the salmon from sticking. Brush the salmon on both sides with the agave nectar and season with salt and pepper, to taste. Grill until the fish flakes easily and is cooked through, about 3 to 4 minutes on each side. Transfer the salmon to a platter and allow to rest for 5 minutes. Spoon the salsa verde on top of the salmon or serve on the side as an accompaniment.

Honey Dew Me

A delicate shot and it has a fabulous honey and lemon flavor, plus it comes with options. Depending on your taste you can opt for either orange or pineapple juice - both would be interesting but I would probably opt for orange myself.

Ingredients

- 2 parts Bärenjäger honey liqueur
- 1 part lemon liqueur
- orange juice or pineapple juice

Preparation

1. Pour the liqueurs and juices into a cocktail shaker filled with ice.
2. Shake well.
3. Strain into a shot glass.

Bärenjäger is a honey-flavored *liqueur* produced in Germany. It is a blend of *vodka*, honey from the Yucatan Peninsula in Mexico and other "secret" natural ingredients.

Charles C. (Cropper) Parks was contracted by a 4-person committee in 1982 to create a likeness of William Penn, for a tall bronze statue in New Castle, Delaware, where Penn landed in October, 1682.

Members of the committee were

Claudie Brock, George Freebury, Grace Hayford, and Jack Klingmeyer.

The statue was cast at Tallix Foundry in New York state, but the records were all destroyed due to the company being sold, and then bought back by the Tallix family.

Sometime (no exact date?) in 1984, the piece was unveiled where it stands today.

The original design included a sizable oval or nearly round plinth surrounding the statue, using bricks salvaged during the demolition of the Tile House, on the Strand.

The City of New Castle never raised the funds for that plinth; thus the tiny square brick plinth on which the piece sits. Later, the bronze plaque honoring the Welcome Society, was placed at the bottom. (The ship Penn arrived on was called "Welcome," and like the Kalmar Nyckel, went back and forth across the Atlantic Ocean and brought dozens of families to The New World. Their descendants are active maintaining an awareness of the importance of The Welcome.)

Linda Lennon of Newark, and Doug Martenson (Philadelphia) performed the work on Wednesday, July 31 and Friday, August 2nd, using a non-invasive approach (no(!) sand-blasting...), and found a particular hue common to the piece, made it uniform (monochrome, within reason...), and then applied two coats of hot wax, and buffed it.

With cleaning and new coats of wax each year, or every other year, another complete refurbishment will never be necessary.

Joint Investigation Results in Arrest

Detectives from New Castle County and New Castle City Police Departments have conducted a lengthy investigation into the recent burglaries in the areas of Penn Acres, Wilmington Manor Gardens, Jefferson Farms and other New Castle communities.

New Castle County Police have a documented five burglaries in their jurisdiction with New Castle City Police reporting a documented 12 burglaries.

On Sunday, (7/28), at approximately 1:25 a.m., detectives from both agencies executed a joint operation to end the rash of burglaries in the aforementioned neighborhoods. The plan was successful with the arrest of Michael Parks, a 39 year-old male who resides in the 900 block of School Street in New Castle, DE.

Detectives observed Michael on a bicycle in the area of Vassar Avenue and he was subsequently stopped a short time later. Detectives located property on Michael's person and learned that it did not belong to him. After locating the victim, who resides in the community of Penn Acres, police learned that she was unaware that the property had been taken.

Michael was charged with Burglary in the Second Degree and Theft Under \$1,500. He was committed to Howard R. Young Correctional Facility in lieu of posting \$10,000 cash bail. **He was also issued a no contact order with the community of Penn Acres.**

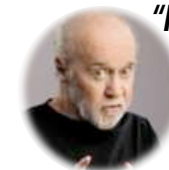

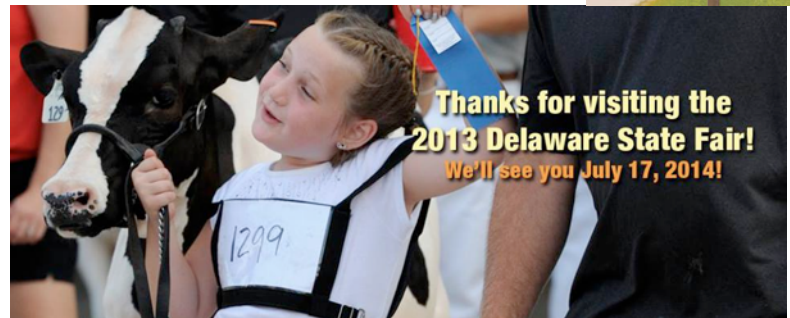

Dear Editor,

As a former resident of New Castle, DE, I recently visited for Separation Day, and visited several times since. It has been a nostalgic journey to walk the City of Historic New Castle and revisit all the places I

did in my youth. It was during the Separation Day Parade when I first noticed the United States Post Office was not flying our national colors, nor was the rusted, paint chipped pole maintained in a condition to fly the flag of the United States. On return visits, I found this pole still to be in the same condition, where it stands out in contrast of the flags flying from residential homes, city and county buildings and street lined light poles. One would think that this post office is of some historical value and the Post Master General has the funds to keep its facilities maintained in a fashion deserving of the title; United States Post Office, New Castle DE 19720.

Some of the steps I have taken to bring attention to this violation are: 1) Called the listed number (302) 328-2392 twice to contact the post office; however the number is "unavailable"; 2) Talked directly to a postal employee at the post office; 3) Sent a letter to the United States Post Master General via the USPS on-line web page; 4) Sent a letter to Senator Coons office via his on-line web page; 5) Called the Post Master General's Office, New Castle Post Office, Quigley Blvd.; and 5) Filed a New Castle City Complaint Form (City Codes Violation). To date, I am still waiting for a proper USPS response.

As a retired US Marine my attention to detail could be consider trite, but I see a trend in that when the normal everyday activities are neglected, then bigger problems usually follow. It is these reasons I write to you to intercede, to direct some influence and raise awareness in reversing the neglect of this post office's flag pole. The residents of New Castle, out-of-state and foreign visitors should not have to see the lack of respect for a federal facility flag pole, void of flying the United States of America's National Flag in one of the most historic towns in our nation.

The local Post Master General and USPS supervisors must correct the violations as approved by United States Federal Government and published in the manual governing the USPS regulations.

United States Postal Service (USPS) Administrative Support Manual (ASM), ASM 13, July 1999,
Updated With Postal Bulletin Revisions through May 12, 2005
472 U.S. Flag Display

472.21 Where Displayed

The flag of the United States must be displayed on stationary flagstaffs at all post offices, branches, stations, terminals, garages, and postal facilities, including leased and rented premises. If the post office unit is located in a facility operated by the General Services Administration, that agency's regulations on the display of the flag govern. If the post office unit is located on a military reservation, the military regulations on the display of the flag on the reservation govern.

472.22 When Displayed

When employees are on duty in a postal facility, the flag must be displayed except in severe weather as noted in 472.14. It is raised as soon after sunrise as practicable and lowered at the time of closing or no later than sunset.

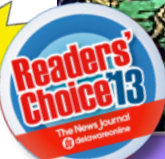

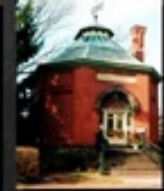
