

The original recipe for 'Maccaroni Cheese' reads as follows:

"Boil the maccaroni in milk; put in the stewpan butter, cheese, and seasoning; when melted, pour into the maccaroni, putting breadcrums over, which brown before the fire all together."

As you can see, it is not very precise about ingredient measurements so we are free to interpret as best as we can. During Civil War they used

long, straight "pipe maccaroni" (in Italy called Bucatini) for this recipe. I didn't have them on hand so I used penne instead. If one wants to be completely authentic, one should make their own macaroni and probably use Parmesan cheese.

#### What to used

 2 1/2 cups macaroni (or penne)

4 cups milk

3 Tbsp butter

ground pepper (black or white)

a pinch of nutmeg 

1 cup Parmesan cheese a pinch of paprika

#### What you do

- 1. Boil macaroni noodles for about 15 minutes in milk with a pinch of salt. Be careful since the milk could boil over.
- 2. When macaroni are done, and they absorb most of the milk, add butter, parmesan cheese, pepper and nutmeg to the pot. Stir until butter and cheese melt.
- 3. Transfer to a buttered baking dish (volume 4 cups or 1 liter). Combine bread crumbs with paprika and sprinkle over macaroni. Bake in 350F oven for about 20 minutes or until breadcrumbs become lightly brown.



## **COASTAL ZONE NOTICE**

Coastal Zone Act Permit Re:

#### **Techmer Engineered Solutions, LLC**

Under the authority of the Coastal Zone Act (7 Del. Code, Chap. 70) and the "Regulations Governing Delaware's Coastal Zone," the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) has issued a Coastal Zone Act Permit to Techmer Engineered Solutions, LLC ("Techmer").

Techmer submitted a permit application on June 1, 2015, to manufacture uniform, compounded, engineering plastic resin pellets in an existing steel and masonry

compounded, engineering plastic resin peliets in an existing steel and masonry commercial structure located at

1600 Johnson Way, Centerpoint Business Complex, New Castle.

A public hearing was held on July 21, 2015, in the DNREC facility at 391 Lukens Drive, New Castle. Environmental impacts to air quality are anticipated; the applicant has obtained eight (8) VOC credits (four (4) ozone season and four (4) non-ozone season) from the Delaware Economic Development Office as their offset.

Anyone wishing to appeal this decision to the State Coastal Zone Industrial
Control Board must do so by August 19, 2015.

An appeal form may be acquired by calling Vicki Ward at (302) 739-9000. There is a \$100 appeal application fee. If no appeal is received within the appeal

period, this decision becomes final.

When Senator Carper visited Penn's Place last Friday he expounded the virtues of Delaware and how little America knows of our gem of a home. (he was wearing the obligatory blue and gold necktie).

The colonial blue field and the buff colored diamond were said, by members of the commission established to design the state flag, to represent the colors of a uniform worn by General George Washington. And, indeed, some regiments of the Revolution wore blue coats with buff trim. The diamond is a reference to an early state nickname, the Diamond State, so given because of Delaware's small size and great value, evidenced in its geographical position on the Atlantic Ocean and its leadership contributions.


