Last Sunday, the New Castle City Police held a GONES WITH GOPS bicycle safety event in the Dobbinsville community that gave the kids an opportunity to bond with police and learn about bicycle safety. The event, coordinated by **Cpl. Richard Perillo** and paid for by the officers of New Castle City Police, went from 1-3pm. Nearly 100 neighbors attended. During the event, kids were treated to a free ice cream served up by Alex Meloro of

"The Ice Cream Shoppe". Kids were able to "Race the Cops" on a controlled course, maneuver through a "Balance Box" that taught the riders how to turn and maneuver in tight areas, and put their bikes through a safety inspection area where volunteers from the community tightened handlebars, seats, chains, brakes and checked tires. Dobbinsville is a small community divided by a very busy roadway, so it is important to educated the community about the safety of crossing the road, looking both ways and proceeding with caution. **COBBLESTONES**

*Okay...we're fortunate that peaches are in season and bourbon is always in season. This makes the end of a great meal, a feast to remember.* 

So, go to the pantry & get: 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cups sugar 4 peaches, cut into 1/2-inch wedges (about 1 ¼ lbs) 2 to 3 tbsps bourbon 11/2 cups all-purpose flour 1/4 cup finely ground pecans 1 tsp baking powder (00) 1/2 tsp baking soda COBBLE 1/2 tsp salt • 1 cup buttermilk 1 stick unsalted butter, at room temperature • 2 large eggs • 1 tsp pure vanilla extract

#### DIRECTIONS

Crank up the oven to 375°. Combine ¾ cup sugar and 1½ water in a 10-inch ovenproof skillet until the mixture looks like wet sand. Cook over medium-high heat, gently swirling the pan occasionally but not stirring, until light amber, about 5 minutes. Remove from the heat and arrange the peaches in concentric circles over the caramel. Make happy with the bourbon; set the skillet aside.

Whisk the flour, ground pecans, baking powder, baking soda and salt in a bowl. Beat the butter and the remaining 1 cup sugar in a large bowl with a mixer on medium-high speed until light and fluffy, about 3 minutes. Add the eggs one at a time, beating after each addition, then beat in the vanilla. Reduce the mixer speed to low; add the flour mixture in 3 batches, alternating with the buttermilk, beginning and ending with the flour, and mix until just incorporated. Pour the batter over the peaches and spread evenly.

Transfer the skillet to the oven and bake until the cake is golden and a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean, about 50 minutes. (Cover loosely with foil if the cake is browning too quickly.) Let sit 15 minutes, then invert onto a platter and let cool completely.


