New Castle finally recognized

Mayor Michael Quaranta, Councilperson Suzanne Souder and Council President Linda Ratchford attended the Delaware City announcement of four new Downtown Development Districts (DDD) including one in the City of New Castle of 530 parcels totaling 85 acres comprised of a mix of neighborhoods and uses within a concentrated core: The Historic center; 7th and South Street area; Ferry Cut-Off area; and the Shawtown neighborhood. The DDD program includes rebates up to 20% of hard construction projects and a host of other benefits for homeowners and businesses [More HERE.](#)

Shawtown drug arrest

Patrol Officers with the New Castle City Police Department arrested a man after witnessing a traffic violation in the Shawtown area of New Castle. Nicolaus Smith of Clayton,

Spicy Clams with Garlicky Toasts

There's nothing more satisfying than a big potful of steamed clams. To say they practically cook themselves is perhaps a slight exaggeration

5 tbsp extra-virgin olive oil - 1 c. chopped scallions, trimmed, white and green parts - 3 garlic cloves, minced, plus 2 whole garlic cloves, peeled - 2 serrano peppers, finely chopped - 1 c. dry white wine - 1 c. chicken broth - 4 lbs littleneck or Manila clams, scrubbed - 1 baguette, split lengthwise, then halved crosswise - ½ c. roughly chopped parsley - 1 c. roughly chopped cilantro leaves and tender stems - 1 packed c. small basil leaves, Lemon wedges, for serving

PrepTime

Set a heavy-bottomed soup pot or Dutch oven over medium-high heat and add 2 tbsp olive oil. When oil is hot, add scallions and let sizzle for a minute without browning. Add garlic and peppers, stir and let sizzle for 15 seconds.

Add wine and broth, and turn heat to high. Add clams, and clamp on lid. Cook for 7 or 8 minutes, stirring once or twice, until all clams have opened. Turn off heat and keep pot covered.

As clams cook, prepare the baguette: Under the broiler, toast the bread cut-side up until it's golden. Rub the cut side of baguette with a peeled garlic clove and drizzle each of the four pieces with about 1/2 tablespoon olive oil.

Just before serving, throw parsley, cilantro and basil into the pot and stir well to distribute.

Ladle clams and broth into big soup bowls. Serve with garlic toasts for sopping and lemon wedges. For a dramatic presentation, set a single long toast atop each bowl.

San Antonio Margarita

Combine equal parts **tequila**, **orange liqueur** and **fresh lime juice** in a pitcher, using a measuring glass if you have one to get it to 26 ounces exactly (deploy a splash or so more than a cup per liquid if you don't), then add 6 ounces of water to the mix and set it in the refrigerator to chill. Serve over ice in glasses with salted rims.

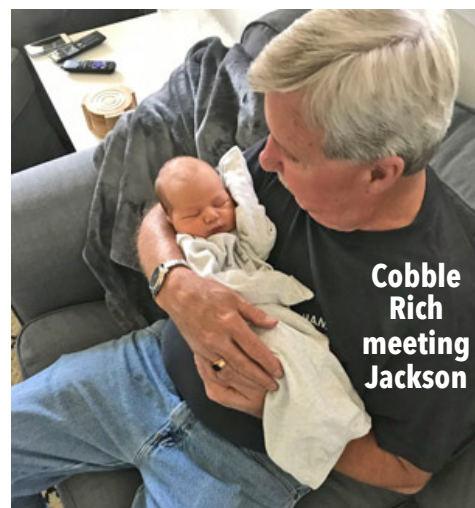

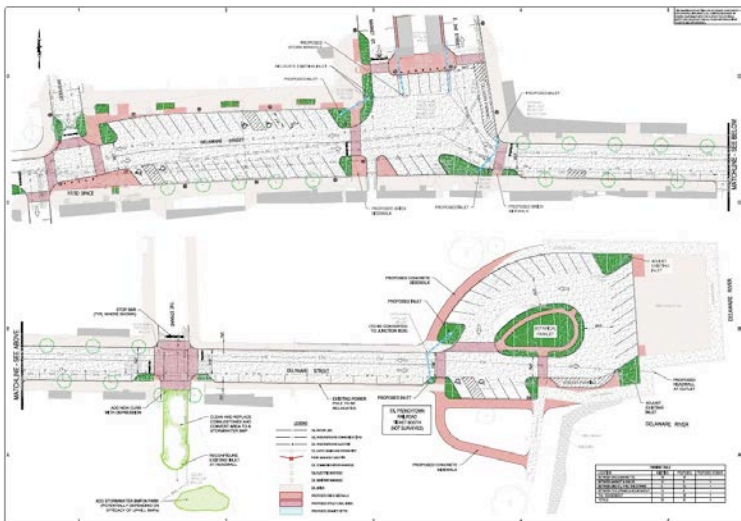

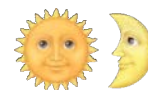
