

"New Castle: Three Forts, One Community" Exhibit to open at the New Castle Court House Museum on Sept. 9th



A new exhibit examining the 17th-century struggle for control of New Castle by the Dutch, Swedes and English, will open to the public on Saturday, Sept. 9th at the New Castle Court House Museum located at 211 Delaware Street in New Castle.

Between 10 am and 4:30 pm on Sept. 9th, the museum will celebrate the exhibit opening with a series of activities including Dutch and Swedish re-enactors and encampments; museum and exhibit tours; Swedish craft-activities for children; a walking tour of the site of Fort Casimir; on-board tours of the Kalmar Nyckel, a replica of one of the ships that brought the first Swedish settlers to what is now Delaware; and Dutch-, Swedish- and English-style refreshments. Except for Kalmar Nyckel

tours (\$5), admission is free and open to the public. For information, call 302-323-4453.

Modern-day New Castle traces its origin to the conflict between three great colonial powers-Netherlands, Sweden and England. From 1651 to 1681, these nations vied for control of the Delaware Valley and the profitable trade in natural resources with the region's American-Indian inhabitants. In response to the Swedish stronghold (Fort Christina) constructed at present-day Wilmington, the Dutch established a fortified settlement five miles to the south. For the next 30 years the Dutch, Swedes and English would contest and occupy this outpost. Each nation would enforce its claim through a series of fortifications - Fort Casimir (Dutch), Fort Trinity (Swedish) and Fort New Castle (English). These forts were an anchoring presence within the developing community and have not been completely lost to time. Archaeological excavations have found the site of Fort Casimir and recovered artifacts which are on display in the exhibit. To this day, the distinct cultural influences of the three colonial powers can still be found in New Castle.

Bobby Flay's Tangerine Maple Glazed Chicken Thighs Drumsticks

go to market

5 tbsp canola oil ~ 1 small red onion, coarsely chopped 1 gt tangerine juice or tangerine-orange juice, not from concentrate ~ 4 sprigs fresh thyme ~ 1 tangerine or orange, zested ~ 1/4 cup pure maple syrup ~ 1 tbsp low-sodium soy sauce ~ 1 tsp coarsely ground black pepper, plus more for seasoning ~ 8 chicken drumsticks ~ 8 bone-in chicken thighs Salt ~ 2 green onions, thinly sliced, for garnish ~ Grilled limes, oranges and tangerines

let's cook

Happy the grill to medium-high. Heat 2 tbsp of the oil in a medium saucepan over high heat, add the onion and cook until soft, 3 to 4 min. Add the juice and thyme, (good squirt of Penn Farm Honey too) bring to a boil and cook, stirring occasionally, until thickened and reduced to approximately 1/2 cup, 20 to 25 min.

Strain the mixture into a bowl and whisk in the syrup, soy sauce and black pepper and let cool to room temperature. Can be made 2 days in advance. Bring to room temperature first. Brush chicken on both sides with the remaining oil and season with salt and pepper. Grill until golden brown on both sides and just cooked through. Begin brushing with the glaze during the last 5 minutes of grilling. Remove to a platter and sprinkle with the green onion. Garnish with grilled citrus.

The NCPD is asking its citizens to assist them in their crime prevention and crime solving efforts. The NCPD is introducing a Security Camera Community Registration Program.

This program will allow business and home owners to register their surveillance systems with the NCPD. This registration process will allow the NCPD to easily identify camera systems in the vicinity of a crime scene, and enable them to contact the owner for assistance in obtaining video evidence for their investigation. In many cases this will speed up cases and prosecution, which in turn will save money for the taxpayer by reducing the amount of man hours spent on an investigation.

This *will not* give the police the ability to freely access your cameras, claim ownership, or dictate the camera system's function. This is simply a database that will allow our police department to see who might have captured footage related to a crime .
