She said the Commission will be monitoring the activity and, if this becomes a continual problem, further steps could be taken to help enforce this rule.

Ms. Pantone related that City Council would be receptive to assisting MSC if it becomes necessary.

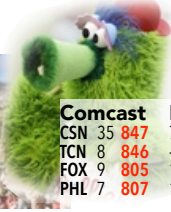

The day that never happened In 1752, the day of **3rd of September** never happened - nor next 10. England and the American Colonies dropped the Roman era Julian Calendar, which had become 10 days out of synchrony with the solar cycle, and adopted the Gregorian Calendar. People rioted in the streets thinking the government stole 11 days of their lives. Instituted by Pope Gregory XIII in 1582, the calendar has 365 days with an extra day every four years (the leap year) except in years divisible by 100 but not divisible by 400.

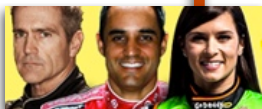

CITRUS MARINATED *grilled* chicken



stuff you'll need to get ready

- 2 lbs skin-on, bone-in chicken thighs, breasts or legs -
- 1 tsp finely grated lime zest
- 1 tsp finely grated orange zest
- 1/4 c. fresh lime juice*
- 1/4 c. fresh orange juice*
- 1/4 c. reduced-sodium soy sauce
- 2 tbsps olive oil
- 1 tbsp coarse kosher salt
- 3 tbsps scallions, thinly sliced
- 1/2 bunch cilantro, leaves and tender stems only
- 2 garlic cloves*, roughly chopped

Teditor used 3 thighs and 1 breast that was cut in half so it could absorb the marinade better

**(comes in a jar too!)*

Drag out the blender, or whatever, and add scallions, cilantro, garlic, lime zest, orange zest, lime juice, orange juice, soy sauce, olive oil and kosher salt. Blend or pulse the ingredients until a coarse puree forms. *Pretty huh?* Set aside 1/4 cup to use for topping the cooked chicken. Put the chicken into a gallon sized ziploc bag. Add in the remaining marinade, and zip 'r up. Shake or turn the bag a bit so that all of the marinade gets on and seeps into all of the chicken. Butcha already know that!

Let marinate for at least 30 minutes or up to a couple hours (*or over night*) in the refrigerator. Preheat the grill. Remove the chicken from marinade and let excess drip back into dish. Place chicken on the hot grill, without overcrowding the pieces. Keep a water bottle handy for fair-ups.

Grill until fully cooked through, turning occasionally, about 15 minutes total, depending on how hot your grill is.

Serve immediately. Enjoy all evening!

SUMMER STORM

Ingredients

- 1/2 c. blueberries
- 1 tbsp water
- 1/2 oz fresh lime juice
- 1/2 oz simple syrup
- 2 ozs gin or vodka
- Splash of soda water
- Mint for garnish

The season loudly calls for the greatest efforts of every friend to his Country.

— George Washington, Wilmington, to Caesar Rodney, August 31, 1777, calling for the assistance of the Delaware militia in rebuffing the British advance to Philadelphia.

On the home front, Delawareans experienced the war firsthand during the Philadelphia campaign of 1777, when British troops crossed through the northern part of the state and occupied the city of Wilmington. **The Battle of Cooch's Bridge** was fought near Newark as American light infantry tried to delay the British advance through the state.

Upon hearing of the British landing, Washington assembled a reconnaissance party that included Generals Lafayette and Nathanael Greene and rode out from Wilmington to observe the enemy camp. The Americans' presence at the top of Iron Hill was noted by one of Howe's aides, Captain Friedrich von Muenchhausen, who wrote in his diary on August 26th, "We observed some officers on a wooded hill opposite us, all of them either in blue and white or blue and red, though one was dressed unobtrusively in a plain grey coat. The Gentlemen observed us with their glasses as carefully as we observed them. Those of our officers who know Washington well, maintained that the man in the plain coat was Washington. The hills from which they were viewing us seemed to be alive with troops".

On the 2nd of September, British and Hessian troops under Howe's command marched into New Castle County, and spread out in several directions, fueling speculation that they intended to "extend themselves in a line from Bay to Bay."

On the morning of September 3, 1777, British and Hessian troops marching east through Delaware under the command of General Cornwallis encountered General William Maxwell's special corps of light infantry about a mile north of Aiken's Tavern. Under Washington's orders to "give every possible annoyance" to the enemy, Maxwell's corps of 800 marksmen fired from the cover of the woods and ravines along the road to Cooch's Bridge. At the forefront of the British line was Lieutenant Colonel Friedrich Von Wurmb's elite force of German jägers who responded with cannon-fire and a bayonet charge, ultimately forcing the Americans to withdraw. The running fight ended in a final skirmish in the vicinity of the Welsh Tract Baptist Church. As the day ended, Maxwell's corps retreated four miles north to rejoin the main American army on White Clay Creek.

Did Maxwell Use the Stars and Stripes?

There are no known contemporary reports that state that Maxwell's Corps did or did not have a flag. Tradition and circumstantial evidence gathered by historians in later years supports a conclusion that the stars and stripes flag was first flown in battle here.

The purpose of the hearing is to solicit the views of interested parties in regards to the Federal Consistency Determination filed by the Delaware City Refinery Company, LLC (DCRC). DCRC is requesting

to install two sets of wave attenuating devices (WAD) parallel to 2,600 linear feet of shoreline to protect the eroded bank along the Delaware River in New Castle County, Delaware. Portions of the shoreline will be stabilized with approximately 1,015 cubic yards of material from an on-site dredged material storage area. Proposed work is in response to erosion from storms in the area and will protect the ship docking and associated landward infrastructure required by the DCRC by reestablishing the natural marsh and the beach through the design of the WADs.
