

On your counter 6-8 fresh Delaware peaches, peeled and sliced

- 1 stick unsalted butter, melted 1 cup flour
- 1 cup sugar 1 cup brown sugar 1 tbsp baking powder
- 1/8 tsp salt 1 cup milk 1 tsp vanilla extract Juice from 1/2 lemon

let's do it!

Have a happy oven @ 375° • Pour melted butter into center of 9x13-inch baking dish, do not spread butter around pan. • In a separate bowl, combine flour, 1 cup sugar, salt, and baking powder. Slowly pour in milk and vanilla extract, and stir to combine. Pour batter over butter, but do not stir. • Add brown sugar, peach slices, and lemon juice to a saucepan on high heat. Stir frequently until sugar is completely melted and peaches have released their juices. • Pour peaches over top of batter. Do not stir. • Bake for 40-45 minutes or until top is a golden in color.

Serve warm or cold, or with a scoop of ice cream. Enjoy!

The secret to this milkshake is soaking the raisins in <u>rum</u>, then blending the softened fruit with vanilla ice cream that's scented with cinnamon and orange zest.

- •¼ cup raisins
- •1 $\frac{1}{2} \pm oz rum$
- •⅓ cup milk
- •½ tsp orange zest
- Pinch ground cinnamon
- •4 large scoops vanilla ice cream
- Whipped cream, for topping
- Crushed toffee, for garnish

Ready?

Put the raisins in a small bowl and pour the rum over. The raisins should be submerged in the rum. Let soak until the raisins are plump, about 30 minutes.

Drain the raisins, reserving the rum. Add to the jar of the blender. Add the milk, orange zest and cinnamon, and blend for 15 seconds. Add the vanilla ice cream and rum, and blend until smooth. Pour into a pint glass, and garnish with whipped cream and crushed toffee. Serve immediately.







The First Labor Day

The first Labor Day holiday was celebrated on Tuesday, September 5, 1882, in New York City, in accordance with the plans of the Central Labor Union. The Central Labor Union held its second Labor Day holiday just a year later, on September 5, 1883. In 1884 the first Monday in September was selected as the holiday, as originally proposed, and the



Central Labor Union urged similar organizations in other cities to follow the example of New York and celebrate a "workingmen's holiday" on that date. The idea spread with the growth of labor organizations, and in 1885 Labor Day was celebrated in many industrial centers of the country.

The form that the observance and celebration of Labor Day should take was outlined in the first proposal of the holiday — a street parade to exhibit to the public "the strength and esprit de corps of the trade and labor organizations" of the community, followed by a festival for the recreation and amusement of the workers and their families. This became the pattern for the celebrations of Labor Day. The vital force of labor added materially to the highest standard of living and the greatest production the world has ever known and has brought us closer to the realization of our traditional ideals of economic and political democracy. It is appropriate, therefore, that the nation pay tribute on Labor Day to the creator of so much of the nation's strength, freedom, and leadership — the American worker.


HARVEST

But, this year, the September 6 full moon comes too early to be the Northern Hemisphere's official Harvest Moon, according to the most widely accepted definition of the term. That's because the full moon of October 5th, will fall closer to this year's September 22 equinox. The October 2017 full moon will be this year's Harvest Moon, while the September 5-6 full moon will carry its ordinary monthly full moon name of Fruit Moon. Read more about full moon names.

However, in most respects, the September 2017 and October 2017 full moons can be regarded as Harvest Moon co-stars.
