



Summer Pasta with Zucchini, Ricotta and Basil

You'll Need Extra-virgin olive oil ·1 small onion, finely diced · 2 lbs zucchini, sliced into 1/4-inch-thick pieces (for larger zucchini, cut in half lengthwise before slicing)

Salt and pepper 2 garlic clow chopped basil (11bz 8 cm).

2 garlic cloves, minced, or 2 tbsp chopped green garlic · 1 oz basil (about 2 cups loose leaves)
11b ziti or other dry pasta · 8 oz ricotta, about 1 cup Pinch of crushed red pepper · zest of 1 lemon · 2 oz grated Parmesan, pecorino or a mixture, about 1 cup, plus more for serving

Now fixn'

Put a pot of water on to boil. In a large skillet over medium-high heat, cook the onions in 3 tablespoons olive oil until softened, 5 to 8 minutes. Reduce heat as necessary to keep onions from browning. Add zucchini, season

generously with salt and pepper, and continue

cooking, stirring occasionally until rather soft, about 10 minutes. Turn off heat.

Meanwhile, use a mortar and pestle to pound garlic, basil and a little salt into a rough paste (or use a mini food processor). Stir in 3 tablespoons olive oil.

Salt the pasta water well and put in the pasta, stirring. Boil per package instructions but make sure to keep pasta quite al dente. Drain pasta, reserving 1 cup of cooking water.

Add cooked pasta to zucchini in skillet and turn heat to medium-high. Add 1/2 cup cooking water, then the ricotta, crushed red pepper and lemon zest, stirring to distribute. Check seasoning and adjust. Cook for 1 minute more. Mixture should look creamy. Add a little more pasta water if necessary. Add the basil paste and half the grated cheese and quickly stir to incorporate. Spoon pasta into warm soup plates and sprinkle with additional cheese. Serve immediately.





Proposed Universal Recycling Regulations **Public Workshops**

Division: Waste and Hazardous Substances

The Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) Division of Waste and Hazardous Substances (DWHS) will hold public workshops on proposed new Universal Recycling Regulations.

The purposes of the proposed regulations are to ensure: that collection services for recyclable materials are consistent with the law; the collected recyclable materials are not landfilled or incinerated; the recyclable materials are properly processed and enter the marketplace; recycling in Delaware can be effectively measured; and that waste diversion is maximized through the reduction of solid waste deposited in our landfills.
