The Delaware Municipal Electric Corporation (DEMEC), in coordination with the American Public Power Association (APPA) and public power utilities from across the country, sent crews to Florida in advance of Dorian's arrival. Sheriff's House rehab moving forward

The National Park Service Development Advisory Board has approved the project scope and schematic design for adaptive re-use of the historic Sheriff's House, a preliminary step in rehabilitation of the building. The Sheriff's House will be the central visitor contact station for all seven sites of First State National Historical Park with areas for orientation, exhibits, education, and rest rooms. The project also includes a new heating and air conditioning system, accessibility and life safety improvements, and office space to support park operations.



"This approval is a major step forward in the development of First State National Historical Park and we know Delawareans are as excited about the progress as we are," said acting park superintendent Eric Breitreutz. "It's an exciting next step for a project that will take several years to complete." The Sheriff's House project will preserve the character of the New Castle National Historic District. All repair and rehabilitation will be within the existing building footprint.

Death by Chocolate



Gonna need

1 package brownie mix prepared according to instructions for 9x13 pan - 1/4 cup brewed coffee
2 packages chocolate mousse mix prepared according to instructions - 16 oz cool whip thawed in fridge overnight - 1/2 cup chopped pecans - 1/2 cup chopped toffee pieces - Milk, eggs, oil, etc. as needed for brownies and mousse

Instructions

Prepare brownie mix according to package instructions, and bake until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean. Allow brownies to cool completely. Once cooled, pierce the brownies all over with a fork, then pour 1/4 cup of brewed coffee over the top of the brownies. Crumble brownies in the pan, and then layer half of the crumbled brownies in the bottom of the trifle bowl. Prepare one of the chocolate mousse mixes according to the instructions on the package. Spread chocolate mousse on top of the brownie layer. Gently layer 8oz of cool whip on top of the mousse.

Sprinkle half of the chopped pecans and toffee pieces over the cool whip.

Repeat all layers, then cover with plastic wrap and let rest in the refrigerator for 2-3 hours.

Serve cold. The trifle is best if eaten within 2-3 days.

I buy pre-chopped chocolate covered toffee pieces instead of chopping up several large bars. You can usually find these at the grocery store next to the chocolate chips.

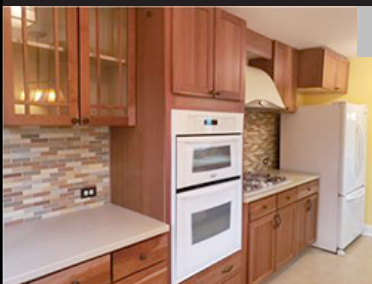

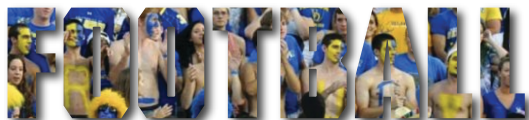
