Battle of the Brandywine

Two hundred forty one years ago, General Sir William Howe and General Charles Cornwallis launch a full-scale British attack on General George Washington and the Patriot outpost at Brandywine Creek near Chadds Ford, in Delaware County, Pennsylvania, on the road linking Baltimore and Philadelphia.

Howe and Cornwallis spilt their 18,000 British troops into two separate divisions, with Howe leading an attack from the front and Cornwallis circling around and attacking from the right flank. The morning had provided the British troops with cover from a dense fog, so Washington was unaware the British had split into two divisions and was caught off guard by the oncoming attack.

Although the Americans were able to slow the advancing British, they were soon faced with the possibility of being surrounded. Surprised and outnumbered by the 18,000 British troops to his 11,000 Continentals, Washington ordered his men to abandon their posts and retreat. Defeated, the Continental Army marched north and camped at Germantown, Pennsylvania. The British abandoned their pursuit of the Continentals and instead began the British occupation of Philadelphia. Congress, which had been meeting in Philadelphia, fled first to Lancaster, then to York, Pennsylvania, and the British took control of the city without Patriot opposition.

The one-day battle at Brandywine cost the Americans more than 1,100 men killed or captured while the British lost approximately 600 men killed or injured. **More on page 3**

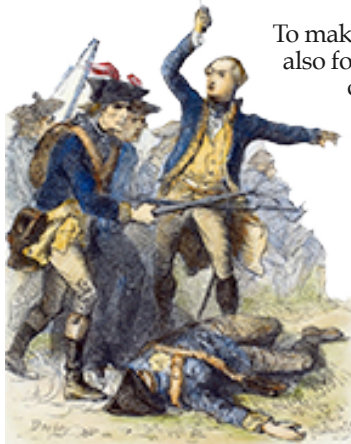

To make matters worse, the Patriots were also forced to abandon most of their cannons to the British victors after their artillery horses fell in battle. Although a defeat for Washington, it's symbolic of the spirit that lived in revolutionary America. After many years of complaints regarding the edicts of King George III and the British Parliament, a movement, subtle at first, but inexorable, with growing intensity emerged as the defining force in the heritage of this country. Tens of thousands of men were willing to put their lives at risk for the idea that people could govern themselves. From a notion

emerged... a new nation. That notion changed the trajectory of human relations as later generations in countries around the globe embraced representational government, republics that put the rights and best interests of common citizens on the same level as those guiding the wealthy aristocracy. There are kids graduating from high school today who know very little about the Battle of the Brandywine, indeed about their own history in general. A few are hardpressed to state whether the Civil War occurred before or after the Revolutionary War. For many, the struggle for independence is a quaint idea, a chapter in a book they were forced to read in school many years ago.

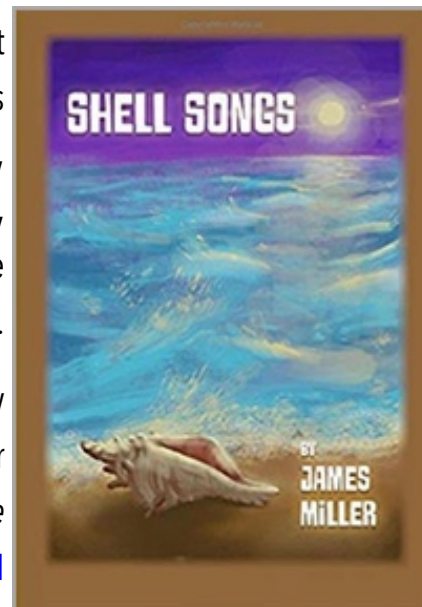

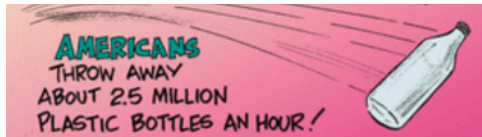

- 5/ Tap **"Delete activity by"**

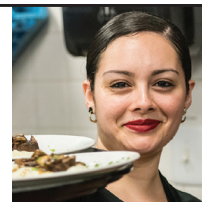
