ROAD CLOSURE

Delaware Street @ Ferry Cut-Off

Look for **orange Detour signs** to start sprouting like spring dandelions as **Norfolk Southern Railroad Company** forces will be replacing, resurfacing and performing general maintenance at the crossing on **Delaware Street (SR 273) @ Ferry Cutoff,** New Castle, New Castle County. Estimated to

begin at 5am on Mon., Sept. 18th, but could be delayed due to weather or other unforeseen circumstances.

The work will require the full closure of **Delaware St** (SR 273) @ **Ferry Cutoff.** Message Boards will be posted 7 days in advance, advising motorists of the closure. The closure will be in place 24 hours per day. The work is expected to be completed and the detour lifted no later than 5am on Wed., Sept. 27th.

Detour Routes:

Eastbound: Delaware Street to East Basin Road onto US 13 to Boulden Boulevard to Moores Lane to Wilmington Road to Sixth Street and return to Delaware Street.

Westbound: Delaware Street onto Sixth Street to Wilmington Road to Moores Lane to Boulden Boulevard to US 13 to Basin Road and back to Delaware Street. Detour signage will be posted for motorists.

While 'working on the railroad...all the day long' construction is scheduled to begin tomorrow, Sept 11th, on the 141/US13 overpass bridge with full closure of SR141 over the bridge to last 45 days and be reopened by the beginning of November. The total contact length is 135 days, with intermittent daytime or nighttime lane closures and weekend closures of each ramp to occur after the bridge opens.



BOURBON BREAD PUDDING

You won't believe how easy it is to get the flavors of Bourbon Street to come to your kitchen when you bake this yummy New Orleans bread pudding. This bread pudding is delicious and makes you feel like you are giving your tummy a warm hug from the inside.



INGREDIENTS

1 loaf french bread • 1 qt milk • 3 eggs • 1½ c sugar • 1 pkg Ocean Spray craisins • 2 tbsp vanilla • 3 tbsp butter BOURBON SAUCE


1 stick butter • 1 c sugar • 1 egg, beaten • 3± tbsp bourbon whiskey

HOW TO MAKE

Tear bread in pieces and soak in milk at least one hour. Beat eggs with sugar and vanilla. Add to bread mixture. Stir in craisins. Melt 3 Tablespoons butter in oblong baking dish. Pour pudding into dish and bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour. Let cool then cut into serving cubes and place in bowls. Top with Bourbon Sauce.

BOURBON SAUCE:

In a saucepan, mix 1 cup sugar, 1 stick butter, 1 egg beaten and 3± tbsp bourbon. Cook on low heat until sugar has dissolved stirring constantly.



Gonna need

3 cup Premium vanilla ice cream, plus more if needed 12 oz Whole milk 3 Ice cubes 2 oz ± bourbon 6 tbsp chocolate syrup, divided

Concocting it!

Place 4 heavy pint glasses in the freezer to chill for 30 minutes. Add the ice cream, milk, ice cubes, bourbon and 4 tbsp of the chocolate syrup to a powerful blender. Blend until smooth. (A good milkshake should be eaten with a spoon, -so if the mixture seems too thin, add another .25 to .5 cup ice cream and blend again.). Divide evenly among

the prepared glasses and top each with . 5 tbsp of the remaining chocolate syrup. Serve immediately.
