

14 miles. R.E. Pierson Construction Company Inc., a New Jersey firm, has been awarded a \$3.167-million contract for demolition and replacement of the bridge. Also known as Fifth Street, was originally built as a drawbridge in 1933 but was converted to a fixed bridge in 1971. The main span is 89 feet long and the overall bridge length is 177 feet, according to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. Completion is expected by February 2017.

Traffic will be detoured via Clinton Street, Cox Neck Road, Clarks Corner Road, U.S. 13, Pole Bridge Road, Port Penn Road, Thorntown Road and West Market Street in Port Penn.

Bicentennial Park public restroom idea flushed...for now.

TRUSTEES

A large turnout of concerned residents voiced their opposition to the much talked about and speculated public restroom in the center of town at Tuesday's first Trustees meeting of the season.

Many sited that property/home values would be seriously affected and suggested that other alternative sites be made available. Trustee president Henry Gambacorta stated that the trustees had nothing to do with the proposed idea and it was a matter for City Council.

Michelle Quaranta said she always makes her 2nd Act business welcome to shoppers in need of the 'facilities'. As does the Court House Museum, Cindy Snyder said. But during open hours only. The public restroom, a stone's trow away in Battery Park, was inadequate and lacked directional signage. Having a facility available 24/7 is extremely costly. Tour operators often tell guests to "take care of business before we get to New Castle".

Taking the biggest hit of the evening was the National Park Service. Their vision of increased tourists visiting town and a Welcome Center have fallen way short. Many asked why the Sheriff's House (once an envisioned visitors center) couldn't be utilized. Funding from the "Feds" just isn't there and likely won't be for the foreseeable future. The New Castle Historical Society has taken the lead to welcome tourists but that's a costly venture too. Some feel that visitors to town visiting museums and businesses will be accommodated by restaurants and shops they visit.

Apple Cider Doughnuts with Honey Bourbon Glaze

INGREDIENTS

for the DOUGHNUTS

Cooking spray 2 cups flour ½ cup sugar 1½ tsps baking powder ½ tsp baking soda ½ tsp salt 1/2 cup apple cider ¼ cup buttermilk 2 tbsps butter melted 2 eggs

for the GLAZE ¼ cup your favorite bourbon ¼ cup Honey ½ cup sugar 1 tbsp ground cinnamon

INSTRUCTIONS

for the DOUGHNUTS Preheat oven to 400°F. Lightly coat two 6-cavity doughnut pans with cooking spray.

In a large bowl, whisk together flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda, and salt. In a separate bowl, whisk together cider, buttermilk, melted butter, and eggs. Stir wet ingredients into flour mixture until it comes together in a thick batter. Take care not to over mix. Scrape batter into a zip-top plastic bag. Snip one corner and pipe into prepared doughnut pan. Batter should come three-fourths of the way up the sides.

Bake for 8-10 minutes, or until a pick inserted in doughnut side comes out clean and doughnut springs back when lightly pressed. Cool in pan for 5 minutes, remove, and cool completely.

for the GLAZE

In a small saucepan, combine bourbon with honey and heat over low until honey is dissolved. Pour glaze into a bowl. In a separate bowl, stir together sugar and cinnamon and pour onto a shallow plate.

Dip a doughnut into glaze, flipping to coat, then into cinnamon sugar mixture. Repeat with remaining doughnuts and serve.






